Blessed Michael J. McGivney

This is a special time to remember the life and legacy of our Order's Founder

On August 12, 1852, Blessed Michael J. McGivney was born into such a family. He was the oldest in a family of thirteen, of which only seven would survive their childhood. He completed his primary education at thirteen and then worked in factories for a few years to help his family before he pursued his calling to the priesthood. Unfortunately, Father McGivney's father passed away while he was in the seminary, and he had to return home to support his family once again.

Now Father McGivney's story could have ended when he returned to help support his family, but his calling was strong and with the help of the Bishop of Hartford, Connecticut he returned to complete his studies and was ordained on December 2, 1877. Once a Priest, Father McGivney realized that there were many in his congregation who had similar problems to what he experienced during his youth. Asking a group of men in his parish to step out of their

comfort zones he helped found the Widows and Orphans Fund that would later become the insurance program the Knights of Columbus enjoys today.

Unfortunately, at the age of 38, Father McGivney died of pneumonia during an outbreak of the Russian flu, but the knights he helped found continued and has become a worldwide movement in the Catholic Church. On 31 Oct 2020 the Venerable Fether Michael J. McGivney was beatified and became Blessed Father Michael J. McGivney. Every year on 13 August we celebrate and honor Blessed Father McGivney. If you aren't a member of the Blessed Michael McGivney guild, please consider becoming one, and pray for a second miracle for use in his canonization as a saint. - Family of the Year submission must be a KC Family.





Faith in Action Knights of Columbus Ultrasound Program Father Reitmeier KoC Council #8848 Tupelo, Mississippi

For many years council #8848 has supported the local crisis pregnancy center, Parkgate Pregnancy Center. Parkgate offers high quality, confidential services. The center has an outstanding, dedicated staff including supportive counselors and a sonographer to guide their clients along the way. All services are free of charge made possible by generous community members, including the Knights of Columbus. Services include pregnancy tests, ultrasound sonography, and counseling. Parkgate also provides the Empower program, a relevant, real-life class for students in grades 7-12 teaching healthy decision making, sexual risk avoidance, and more. Other services include parenting for first time parents; mentor programs to support new Moms and Dad. Parkgate connects clients with other resources in the community.

The unique location of the pregnancy center provides visibility to potential clients in an underserved community. The nearest abortion clinic is in Memphis, TN about 100 miles away. There are two major universities and a U.S. Air Force base within 60 miles of the center.

Parkgate's need to replace their aging, leased ultrasound machine and the Supreme Knights of Columbus Ultrasound Program was a natural fit. The program has well defined parameters and criteria. With the support of KofC supreme and state officers, our local council was able to successfully navigate through the process.

Parkgate Pregnancy Center formally qualified for the ultrasound program after a thorough survey on December 6, 2021 by the Catholic Diocese of Jackson. The Tupelo KoC council's major fund-raiser event, the 6th Annual Charity Concert Gala, took place on August 13, 2022, at St. James Catholic Church. The concert featured extremely talented musicians from the region. There were over 200 concert goers from the parish and community. Ultimately, about \$11,000 was raised at the event. The Mississippi council generously contributed \$7,000 for a total of \$18,000 raised. Supreme Knights of Columbus Ultrasound Program added the other 50% of funds for a grand total of \$36,000 for the final purchase of the GE Ultrasound machine. Collaboration among the Pregnancy Center, Jackson Diocese, then local, state, and supreme KoC council has been inspiring. This was truly a Blessed project.

The local Ultrasound Program officially concluded with a dedication ceremony on May 23, 2023 at Parkgate Pregnancy Center. Parkgate staff, board members, parishioners from St. James Catholic Church, and KoC members were in attendance to enjoy the celebration. One of the highlights was when the sonographer, Stacy Armstrong, demonstrated the new machine and the images of unborn babies it produces. She commented the new machine's quality is a marked improvement over the old one. We agreed the ultrasound room is sacred space where decisions for life are made every day as a direct result of mothers seeing the images of their unborn children.




