This was a two phased food drive. The dates for the drives were selected along with alternates and submitted to Wal-Mart for scheduling in August 2017. The first drive was conducted on Saturday, October 21, 2017, with the second on Saturday, February 3, 2018. The procedure (positioning a truck and trailer midway between the two primary doors, with tables at each door) was the same for both activities. Members would man the tables and collect the food, while the youth would distribute lists of the food pantry's needs. For the first drive, high school students from the Catholic School and the CYO program distributed the lists. For the second drive, the council partnered with a cub scout pack supported by the council. During the first drive, the council collected 1,180 pounds of food and \$803.10. During the second drive, the council collected 2,140 pounds of food and \$1,328.78. Council members delivered food to the food pantry on the Monday after each collection. To determine the amount of food collected, the truck and trailer were weighed at the local grain elevator before and after delivering the food. After the second drive, members of the council joked that the area may be experiencing a shortage of raman noodles as a very large quantity had been collected during the drive. It was a postulated that the second drive was so much more successful than the first, because it was held at the first of the month. The determination of the cub scouts to greet each customer entering the store may have also been a significant factor in the overall success of the second food drive.


