Every first Sunday of the month, the council cooks approximately 250 to 375 sausage and biscuit meals for Holy Savior Catholic Church members. The food is sold as a fundraiser to directly support Council's participation in the RSVP Program (Seminarian Support) and other charitable programs such as Bishop Houck Fund, Bishop Gerow Fund, Ultrasound Initiative and others. This past year, the council raised approximately \$2,000 through these sales to support those charitable organizations.

Cooking begins at 7 am and food is served at 10 am. Approximately 10 council members routinely participate, with a conservative estimate of 3 hours service offered up by each every month.

This program has been a long-standing activity of Council. Not only does it raise funds for our activities, it doubles as a wonderful fraternal experience for those that participate (drinking coffee together, sharing stories and enjoying each others company). A special thank you is offered to Joe Mraz who serves as our "Cooking Captain" and keeps everyone in line! Joe has been working the grill for more than a decade and is ever faithful.
