GRAND KNIGHTS REPORT FRATERNAL YEAR 2007-2007 ST. FRANCIS OF ASSISI COUNCIL 9543 MADISON. MS

Serving as Grand Knight of St. Francis of Assisi Council 9543 in Madison, has been the most rewarding experience in my twenty five years as a Knight of Columbus. It is a very active and energetic council and I wish every knight in the Mississippi jurisdiction could experience the pride and joy of leading one of the most recognized and esteemed councils in the state. It's an opportunity I will always cherish and remember.

It is a tremendous asset to the Grand Knight to have the strong support of the officers and council in each and every activity on our calendar. In addition, we enjoy the full support of our pastor and associate pastor. At our November business meeting, our pastor Fr. Mike Flanery, mentioned that the trees bordering the church property needed to be trimmed and he asked if the knights could find time to help. The next day an email was sent out to the members and, within 24 hours, 18 knights volunteered. On Saturday December 2, the volunteers grabbed their chain saws and pruning sheers, bundled up in coats, stocking caps and gloves in an attempt to brave the chilly temperature, and started pruning and cutting. We trimmed 147 trees and hauled off sixteen trailer loads of limbs. Even our pastor and associate pastor were there with a chain saw and were working right alongside the knights. Both recognized and praised the knights from the pulpit at all Sunday Masses the next day.

Our members do not neglect any area of Columbianism. We promote charity, unity and fraternity equally in our membership, youth, council, community, church and family activities and projects. It was appropriate that we began the fraternal year by hosting the School of Columbianism.

Council Activities

Communication is the life blood of an organization and to keep our members informed the Grand Knight sends out emails, we publish a monthly council newsletter, maintain a council website and compile a scrapbook.

We have a complete First Degree Exemplification Team within our council and do a first degree initiation the third Thursday of every month within the Jackson metro area. Our degree team is privileged to be active participants in welcoming many new knights into the order each month. Also, within the next few months, we will have a Third Degree Team of Exemplars within our council. We will probably be the only council in the state with both a full First Degree and Third Degree Exemplification Team. Our Grand Knight is also the Captain of the Hank Kadjan Fourth Degree Exemplification Team.

Our membership director and his committee developed and published a professional eye-catching council brochure that has been a tremendous recruiting tool and has also caught the attention of the other councils in our district. At a recent district meeting the grand knight from another council perused the brochure and commented, "St. Francis has one upped all of us again."

During February 2006, a knight spoke at each of the Masses and after Mass three knights were present to hand our brochures and answer questions. The results were tremendous. We initiated 12 new knights into the order within 45 days and have a number of other prospective candidates waiting in the wings.

We recognize a knight of the month, a knight of the year and submit a knight of the year at the convention. We conducted a memorial service for deceased knights.

Church Activities

Many knights take an active role in the spiritual life of the parish. Twenty-nine knights and/or their wives serve as Eucharistic Ministers, twelve knights serve as lectors, cleven knights serve as Ministers of Hospitality, four knights serve as Cantors, and eight knights serve as sound board operators. A knight serves as the coordinator of the lectors, the coordinator of Ministers of Hospitality, and the coordinator of the sound board. In addition, Knights serve as Sunday school teachers and are active in the Small Church Community Scripture study program. Knights serve as coordinator of the Small Church Community Program and serve on the Finance Committee. A knight is the President of the Pastoral Council.

On Fridays during Lent, the council sponsors Eucharistic Adoration, leads the rosary, coordinate the Stations of the Cross and prepares and serves a meatless meal. Other church activities include sponsoring a Keep Christ in Christmas Program, adopting a family for Christmas and helping deliver the gifts to the families adopted by the church. The council supports the activities of the missionary work by our youth in Saltillo, donates to the Christopher Fund and recognizes the local clergy with an appreciation dinner.

The Diocesan Rite of Election for all RCIA candidates and their sponsors was held at St. Francis on February 25 and the knights parked cars and greeted and welcomed the future Catholics and visitors from throughout the Diocese of Jackson.

We sponsor an annual Golf Tournament with all the proceeds going to priest's education. During this fraternal year, we proudly donated over \$10,000.00 to the Seminarian Fund. On the state wide automobile raffle for Priest's Education, we sold our initial allotment of raffle tickets and requested more. In addition, we also contributed financially to send a seminarian to the 2007 Convention banquet. Our council tries to truly live up to the motto "In Solidarity with our Priests."

Family Activities

We sponsor a quarterly family communion followed by a pot luck dinner and social. We recognize a family of the month and family of the year and submit a family of the year at the convention.

Many knights and their families attended a Mississippi Braves professional baseball game at Trustmark Park.

We held an annual Council Family Campout in November and it was extremely well attended. The campout was held at the home of our Family of the Year, Chris and Mary Manning. The widows of our deceased brother knights were invited and seven widows accepted our invitation. At the campout, the council family director, who is also our knight of the year, led the rosary. Our associate pastor, who is newly ordained, celebrated a memorial mass in honor of our deceased members and each widow was presented a candle in honor of her husband and a red rose. There were activities for the kids and a relevision set up outside by the grill so the knights could watch the football game on cable. Some families brought tents to spend the night. The council served a delicious meal Saturday night and followed that with a yummy breakfast Sunday morning.

Youth Activities

We sponsored a drug awareness poster contest and participated in the knights of Columbus free throw competition. We have several knights that serve as scout leaders and we have several knights that serve as soccer coaches and referees. One knight coaches, referees and also serves as the commissioner of a soccer league.

We held a fishing tournament for kids.

For the past 15 years, the council has been cooking barbeque chickens on Super Bowl Sunday for the annual fundraiser for the boy scouts. This year sixteen knights cooked over 1,000 chicken halves.. The knights lit the charcoal and fired up the eight large grills at 1:00 am Sunday morning February 2 and the last chicken half was taken off the grill at 9:00 am.

We actively support St. Joseph High School. Knights cooked all the food for the concession stand for the five home football games. We cooked a breakfast for the cheerleaders and football team, catered the athletic banquet serving about 275 people and catered a senior parent and student banquet serving about 250 people. The council catered St. Joseph's Drawdown, the school's largest fundraiser, and served over 1,000 people.

We cooked for the youth Advent Fair at St. Francis and helped raise funds for the youth mission trip to Saltillo. We also donated funds for the Saltillo missionary trip by sponsoring one of the youths.

Community Activities

The council participated in the Tootsie Roll drive for Mentally Challenged, sponsored two Blood Drives, and visited the sick and the elderly. Knights pray the rosary on Saturday at the abortion clinic in Jackson to promote the right to life and the council donated to the Pro-Life Memorial Fund. Knights are also volunteer servers at the Stewpot soup kitchen. The council donated funds and provided labor for the Habitat for Humanity project.

The council cooking team catered the Outdoorama for the Mississippi Fisheries and Wildlife Agencies, the Drawdown fundraiser for the Mississippi Girls Choir and the fundraiser for the Sacred Heart School in Canton.

Conclusion

This has been a tremendous year for Council 9543. One of our greatest assets is our council cooking team and we have earned a tremendous reputation for our culinary talents. Cooking requests come from parishioners within our church and also organizations and residents within our community. Catering gigs provide the largest portion of our revenue while allowing the council the opportunity to promote Columbianism and Evangelize.

We started out the fraternal year on August 5 by defending our title and placing first in the Grillin for Life cooking competition in Madison. Our council cooking team has won the title each year the competition has been held.

A few of our cooking gigs at church this year included, the Advent Fair, the six Lenten meals, a couple of the Wednesday parish dinners, a priest's appreciation dinner, and preparation of all the food at Cajun Fest, which is the church's largest fundraiser.

Some of our community cooking gigs this year were the Outdoorama for the Mississippi Fisheries and Wildlife Agencies, the Drawdown for the Mississippi Girls Choir, the five St. Joseph home football games, Breakfast for the St. Joseph cheerleaders and football team, the St. Peter's Auxiliary Christmas Party, the St Joseph parent student dinner, St. Paul's Founder's Day banquet, the Bar-B-Que chicken cooking for the boy scouts, hamburgers for School Health Fair in Canton, Hamburgers for the Sunnybrook Children's home, the St. Joseph athletic banquet and the St. Joseph Drawdown.

The diversity of the menu and the more than 1,000 people served make the St. Joseph Drawdown our largest cooking gig both in size and financial benefit to the council. April 2007

Another year has come and gone. As I prepare to step down as your State Advocate, I would like to thank all of you for your continued help and support throughout these past two years. I thoroughly enjoyed meeting and talking with all of you as I Linda & 1 traveled around the State.

This Fraternal year started with continuing struggles for many of you recovering from Hurricane Katrina.

Many Churches and Council homes remain damaged and in need of repair. Last year the State Officers researched and laid the groundwork for forming a non profit foundation to work with Supreme and the various jurisdictions throughout our order whenever and wherever disaster strikes. We have not been able to bring that Foundation on line yet, but continued effort should bring it to reality soon.

This year was pretty calm. However, we did have 8 couple of problems pop up that needed our attention. The Supreme Council advised all jurisdictions throughout the Order that because of problems with other Organizations, we as Knights of Columbus must become more sensitive towards how we do our day-to-day business. Accordingly, starting mis year, all State books must be audited yearly with a formal report, preferably by a CPA, sent to Supreme. This was not a big issue for us as our books are audited every year by an audit committee at our state convention with a report sent to Supreme. At this lime Supreme is accepting these reports. However, we may need to obtain the services of a CPA to certify our records in the future. At a local level, the District Deputies must be more vigilant in examining Council books within their District to ensure Council and Supreme by-laws are being adhered to.

Another issue that came up at Supreme level was the use of the KC logo. Again, because of problems surfacing within a different organization. Supreme now requires that each jurisdiction receive written permission from the Supreme Advocate's office before using the KC logo on any money making venture that exists outside of the Knights, PSD Tom Chady called Supreme asking for clarification to see how this affected us. What he found was that we, the Mississippi jurisdiction, must have written permission from Supreme before we can support anything such as last year's car raffle to support Seminarian Education. At this time that determination does not affect local Councils. AH local Councils can still have their draw downs, raffles etc. to support their various donations. I'm sure their will be more to follow on these two issues.

As 1 stated last year, being your State Advocate was not the easy job 1 thought it was, 1 hope 1 have been able to serve you these last two years to your satisfaction. I am very thankful that I had the help and advice from my fellow Sate Officers as well as the Past State Deputies and several of you, my brother knights. It means a lot to know I could always depend on you for help. Thanks to all of you for the kind words, advice and encouragement.

To: Reverend Clergy, State Officers, Delegates and Brother Knights of the 2007 State Convention.

The Knights of Columbus Foundation of Mississippi had a good year raising funds for "People with Intellectual Disabilities" helping many of the state's facilities.

Your Councils collected \$89,485.00 . The 75% returned to you for your local facilities was \$67,078.99. The State Council through the Foundation issued checks totaling \$22,000.00 in January at the board meeting to Statewide facilities.

Of the 59 Councils in the State, 34 sent in funds, which means that 25 Councils did not participate in the drive this past year. Another interesting note is that 2 Councils turned in \$26,557.30, which about 30% of our total this year, but don't let that discourage anyone because most councils sent in from \$50.00 to \$5000.00. All amounts are most welcome.

A final point I would like to make is that you send in your money as soon as it is collected and if waiting on other funds, like Walmart, just include a note to that effect, so I will be aware of your intentions. With your final or total payment send in your "Distribution Form" so I know who you want you check made out too. Also please ask your recipient to deposit the check as soon as possible. I have about \$9,000. in checks that have not cleared our bank account.

How to Donate

Councils should always make their checks payable to either the Diocese of Biloxi or the Diocese of Jackson and not the Mississippi State Council. These donations should be sent to the Memorial Prolife Fund Chairman for recording purposes. Each year all donations will be listed and acknowledged in the Memorial Prolife Fund Chairman's report in our annual convention minute book and the council and assembly making the largest donation will be awarded a certificate at the Convention Banquet. There are plenty of councils that have not donated to this fund yet, so there is much room for improvement and increased donations to this worthy cause.

The fund provides an excellent way for councils, Knights and others to donate memorial gifts in remembrance of deceased Knights, family members, relatives, and friends.

STATE CEREMONIAL CHAIRMAN'S REPORT April 2007

This year, as in past years, has been interesting and challenging for all of us. Two years ago the Ceremonials Committee set a goal of having major exemplifications in each region quarterly. Last year Katrina threw us off our stride. This year we did a little better. Throughout the course of the year we had nine exemplifications, two in the Northern region, four is the Central region and three in the Southern region. Candidates for these exemplifications were at times a little slim. We need a minimum of twenty candidates per exemplification to break even on exemplification costs. however, in the long run, we did fairly well.

Last year, Supreme revised the procedures for the First Degree Exemplification and issued a new exemplification book. Copies were sent out to all Councils throughout the State that had an old book. All the old books were recalled and each of the old degree teams had to be recertified. Getting the old books turned in has been a struggle. To make things easier for everyone, our Worthy State Deputy Larry Tabor drafted form letters designed to help those Councils who lost their books. There are still Councils who, according to Supreme, need to return their old books. Recertification of the degree teams is going slowly as well. A few of the old teams have bees recertified, but if we are going to grow m membership, we need to do better.

Our goal is for each Council to have their own team If that is not possible, then we should have at least one First Degree team in each district.

This year brought on a revised second degree exemplification book. Once again, new books were issued and old books recalled to Supreme. I am happy to say that the recall and recertification went very smoothly. All three teams were recertified. Last year I reported that Hurricane Katrina decimated our second degree team in Biloxi and our third degree team in Pascagoula. Our second degree team in Biloxi has recovered and is once again active. However, our third degree team in Pascagoula did not fair as well. Team captain, Fred Clark did the best he could to bring the team back on line, but the team members were scattered too thin. As a result, our Worthy State Deputy decided it was in the best interest of the state not to recertify the team.

The lack of a third degree team in the southern region creates a void that needs to be refilled. Hopefully, we can get another team certified in the southern region soon. In the mean time, both of the other teams are doing well and doing their best to "take up the slack". I would like to commend brother Fred Clark for his dedication and his efforts to bring the Pascagoula team back together. He has done an outstanding job over the years. We will miss him.

Finally, we are still in desperate need of additional Conferring Officers. For the last three years, I reported that we had only one Conferring Officer and asked for volunteers. Like last year, we had a couple of men express an interest in learning the part, but so one has yet been certified.

This will be my last year serving as your Stale Ceremonials Chairman. Because of other commitments, I have asked to be relieved of my duties in this position. It has been my pleasure to serve you these past three years. I stand ready to assist each of you and whoever replaces me is any way I can.
