Since the beginning of the 2007-2008 fraternal year, the following strides have been made in ceremonials:

We discussed three major areas concerning membership recruitment and retention. Those areas were problems faced by councils, successful practices of councils and the needs of all councils.

Problems

- The lack of resources (men to recruit for knights) This is a particular problem for small
 parishes, since those councils have recruited most, if not all, the eligible catholic men in
 the parish. The only real alternative for many of these councils is to try and make inroads
 into the Hispanic community if there is one.
- 2) The lack of participation by current members This is a problem faced by councils of all sizes. Many times new members are brought into the council and then left to basically fend for themselves. Councils have got to develop more programs for the families of these new members. The most successful councils get the families involved in activities and this gives the new members and even a lot of the older members a reason to get involved with the council and parish.
- 3) Lack of a full time priest When councils are served by a priest that has several parishes or mission churches to serve it makes it more difficult to get the continuous support that the council needs to flourish. This can be particularly a problem when the priest is a military priest and so much time is spent serving the needs of our troops.

Successes

- Visibility The councils that have had the greatest success have been those that have been highly visible within the parish and community. In many instances the councils have been approached by members of the parish wishing to join. The fact that the council and its members do so much for the parish and community shows them that the Knights are truly concerned about what goes on.
- 2) Family Activities Once again the successful councils stress family activities. Since the Knights are a family oriented organization, this should be a major area of activity. This helps bring the sons of Knights, because they see just how much they do for the parish and community. In other words it helps to groom the next generation of Knights for service.
- Wives This goes hand in hand with the family activities. Getting the wives of Knights involved helps to keep the husbands involved in all council activities.

Needs

- Reputation Building If a council builds up the reputation that they can be depended
 upon for whatever activity comes up in the parish, and then they will naturally attract new
 members from the parish. This applies even if it is not a KC function. We all need
 someone or a group we can depend on when we need them.
- 2) Shining Armor Award More councils need to stress the Shining Armor award to their new members. Some of the greatest recruitment successes have been from councils that have pushed the program. It is a great way to get the new members involved in the council and therefore make them better knights.

- 3) Pastoral Support Pastoral support is a key factor in those councils that have excelled. When the parish priest is behind them, there is nothing that they cannot accomplish.
- 4) Inactive & Former Member lists This past year we had our greatest success in bringing former and inactive members back into the councils. We had over 30 men in these categories rejoin our ranks. Use of these lists is a great tool for bringing new blood to the councils.

The meeting was very productive and I strongly believe that such brainstorming between councils of varying sizes can benefit all.

After judging all award entries, the Committee began its meeting.

There was a lively discussion on the subject of a Statewide Raffle. The consensus of those present was favorable of a Raffle; however, they did not favor a Raffle for cash but rather a Raffle of a tangible item, such as an automobile. The Committee also felt that such a Raffle might best be held in separate parts of the state, that is, northern area, central area and southern area. The idea even surfaced about having a Raffle by several councils or one or more districts. There was a strong feeling, however, that any Raffle other than a council Raffle should have a limitation on the number and/or amount of tickets that a council itself could purchase.

Serving as Grand Knight of Council 9543 in Madison has been the most rewarding experience in my twenty six years as a Knight of Columbus. It is a very active and energetic council and I wish every knight in the Mississippi jurisdiction could experience the pride and joy of leading one of the most recognized and esteemed councils in the state. It's an opportunity I will always cherish and remember.

It is a tremendous asset to the Grand Knight to have the strong support of the officers and council in each and every activity on our calendar. In addition, we enjoy the full support of our pastor and associate pastor.

Our members do not neglect any area of Columbianism. We promote charity, unity and fraternity equally in our membership, youth, council, community, church and family activities and projects.

All eight of the Mandatory Reporting Requirements were met by the council this year and at least one member attended the school of Columbianism and Mid-Winter meeting.

Council Activities

Communication is the life blood of an organization and to keep our members informed the Grand Knight sends out emails, we publish a monthly council newsletter, maintain a council website and compile a scrapbook.

We have a complete First Degree Exemplification Team within our council and do a first degree initiation the third Thursday of every month within for the two districts in our immediate area. We also have a complete Third Degree Team of Exemplars within our council. We are probably the only council in the state with both a full First Degree and Third Degree Exemplification Team. In addition, our Grand Knight is on the Fourth Degree Exemplification Team.

Our Knight in Shining Armor Competition this year produced the largest increase in membership we have experienced in one fraternal year in the proud 21 history of our council. We exemplified 34 new knights, with 24 of them becoming third degree members and 16 receiving the prestigious Knight in Shining Armor Award.

Our PR Chairman has been putting together a professional looking recruiting video of our council's activities for the current fraternal year. The video is targeted to be ready in time for Father's Day.

We recognize a knight of the month, a knight of the year and submit a knight of the year at the convention. We conducted a memorial service for deceased knights. We also catered the 50th Wedding Anniversary reception for one of our members.

Church Activities

Many knights take an active role in the spiritual life of the parish. Thirty-five knights and/or their wives serve as Eucharistic Ministers, fourteen knights serve as lectors, eleven knights serve as Ministers of Hospitality, four knights serve as Cantors, and eight knights serve as sound board operators. A knight serves as the coordinator of the Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, a knight serves as the coordinator of the lectors, the coordinator of Ministers of Hospitality, and the coordinator of the sound board. A knight serves as the coordinator of the Altar servers. In addition, Knights serve as Sunday school teachers and are active in the Small Church Community Scripture study program. A knight serves as coordinator of the Small Church Community Program and knights serve on the Finance Committee. A knight is the President of the Pastoral Council.

On Fridays during Lent, the council sponsors Eucharistic Adoration, leads the rosary, coordinates the Stations of the Cross and prepares and serves a meatless meal. All funds raised from the Lenten Meals are dedicated to Priest Education. Other church activities include sponsoring a Keep Christ in Christmas Program, a cash gift of \$250.00 to adopt a family for Christmas and helping deliver the gifts to the more than 80 families adopted by the church. The council supports the activities of the missionary work by our youth in Saltillo, donates to the Christopher Fund and recognizes the local clergy with an appreciation dinner.

We sponsor an annual Golf Tournament with all the proceeds going to priest's education. We proudly donated over \$10,000.00 to the Seminarian Fund.

Our council strives to truly live up to the motto "In Solidarity with our Priests."

Family Activities

We sponsor a quarterly family communion followed by a pot luck dinner and social. We recognize a family of the month and family of the year and submit a family of the year at the convention.

Many knights and their families attended a Mississippi Braves professional baseball game at Trustmark Park.

We held an annual Council Family Campout in November and it was extremely well attended. The widows of our deceased brother knights were invited and seven widows accepted our invitation. At the campout, the council family director, his wife, and a past grand knight lead the memorial rosary. Our associate pastor celebrated a memorial mass in honor of our deceased members and each widow was presented a candle in honor of her husband, a red rose and a Knights of Columbus Memorial Plaque. There were activities for the kids and a television set up outside by the grill so the knights could watch the football game. Some families brought tents to spend the night while others went home to spend the night in their own warm beds. The council served a delicious meal Saturday night and followed that with a gourmet breakfast Sunday morning.

Youth Activities

We sponsored a drug awareness poster contest and participated in the knights of Columbus free throw competition. We sponsored an Essay contest and awarded two \$50.00 gift certificates to the winners. We have several knights that serve as scout leaders and we have several knights that serve as soccer coaches and referees. One knight coaches, referees and also serves as the commissioner of a soccer league.

For the past 16 years, the council has been cooking barbeque chickens on Super Bowl Sunday for the annual fundraiser for the boy scouts. This year eighteen knights cooked over 1,000 chicken halves. The knights lit the charcoal and fired up the eight large grills at 1:00 am Sunday morning February 2 and the last chicken half was taken off the grill at 9:00 am.

We actively support local schools. Our council cooked all the food for the concession stand for the five high school home football games. We cooked a breakfast for the cheerleaders and the football team, catered the athletic banquet serving about 275 people and catered a senior parent/student banquet serving about 250 people. The council catered the high school Draw Down, the school's largest fundraiser, and served over 1,000 people. We donated and cooked hamburgers for the health fair at a local elementary school in the area. We cooked for the youth Advent Fair, the Amazing Race and helped raise funds for the youth mission trip to Saltillo. We also donated \$250.00 each to three of the youths to sponsor them on their Saltillo missionary trip.

Community Activities

The council participated in the Tootsie Roll drive for the Mentally Challenged, sponsored two Blood Drives, and visited the sick and the elderly. Knights pray the rosary on Saturday at the abortion clinic to promote the right to life and the council donates to the Pro-Life Memorial Fund. We donated \$1,000.00 to Pro Life and \$100.00 to the Christopher Fund. Knights are also

volunteer servers at the Stewpot soup kitchen. The council donated \$250.00 in cash and also provided labor for the Habitat for Humanity project.

The council cooking team catered the Outdoorama for the Mississippi Wildlife and Fisheries Agencies, the Drawdown fundraiser for the Mississippi Girls Choir and the fundraiser for the Sacred Heart School.

Conclusion

This has been a tremendous year for our council. Fortunately, our membership includes a large number of great chefs. As a result, one of our greatest assets is our cooking team and our council has earned a tremendous reputation for our culinary talents. Cooking requests come from parishioners within our church and also from many organizations and residents within our community. As our reputation spreads, the requests keep increasing. Catering gigs provide the largest portion of our revenue while allowing the council the opportunity to promote Columbianism and evangelize while cooking. And cooking is something we totally enjoy.

A few of our cooking gigs at church this year included, the Advent Fair, the six Lenten meals, a couple of the Wednesday parish dinners, four priest's appreciation dinnera, and preparation of all the food at Cajun Fest, which is the church's largest fundraiser.

Some of our community cooking gigs this year were the Outdoorama for the Mississippi Wildlife and Fisheries Agency, the Drawdown for the Mississippi Girls Choir, the five high school home football games, breakfast for the high school cheerleaders and football team, the high school parent/student dinner, the Founder's Day banquet for another knights of Columbus council, the Bar-B-Que chicken cooking for the boy scouts, hamburgers for a School Health Fair, the high school athletic banquet and the high school Drawdown. There were quite a few other cooking gigs that are to numerous to mention.

The diversity of the menu and the more than 1,200 people served make the School Drawdown our largest cooking gig both in size and financial benefit to the council. The menu includes seafood gumbo, crab and corn bisque, crawfish etouffee, seafood pasta, boiled shrimp, baked catfish, beef shish-kabob, vegetable shish-kabob, pork tenderloin, beef tenderloin, smoked turkey, smoked chicken legs, sautéed sausage with onions and bell peppers, scalloped potatoes, green beans, and corn macque choux. There were 43 knights who cooked, served or did some of both at the drawdown.

This has been another tremendously exciting and successful fraternal year for council 9543. We are successful because we take advantage of our talent. We accomplished a lot and it has been a privilege and honor to serve as Grand Knight.

You, as all jurisdictions, have been guided first, by your fidelity to the Catholic Church and secondly, the vision of Venerable Servant of God Father Michael J. McGivney.

I bring you the greetings of Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson, the Supreme Officers and the Board of Directors and your 1.75 million brother knights throughout the world. The inspiration and perspiration of determined and valiant men have built this Order and the Mississippi State Council. The foundation upon which we are built is made up of "four" of the 32 virtues which people can possess. These virtues "Charity" - "Unity" - "Fraternity" and "Patriotism" were selected to be the foundations of our Order. Some of the other virtues, "Love" - "Hope" -"Faith" - "Perseverance" - "Gratitude" - "Truth" - "Forgiveness" - "Fortitude" -"Benevolence" - "Justice" - and "Piety," are equally important and interweave through our lives and those of our fellow brother knights. We are the largest, most effective and unique fraternal insurance society in the world. You notice that I said unique. Yes! We are unique! We are unique in our Catholicity; we are unique in our charitable endeavors; we are unique in how we conduct business by Catholic principals; we are unique in that we were founded by a young heroic and virtuous Catholic priest. "Parish Priest," the biography of Father Michael McGivney, tells both his story and that of the founding of our Order. In this book you see the heroic virtue for which he has been declared a "Venerable Servant of God" by the Holy Father. While in New York Pope Benedict XVI even referred to Father McGivney's zeal as an example for all Catholic priests, and connected the Catholic Church's success in America to the dynamic moral leadership of parish priests. Our founder Father Michael J. McGivney is on his way to becoming the most well-known American Catholic parish priest of all time. Soon you will be able to see a 1-hour television special on Fr. McGivney on the History Channel and Biography. If it is God's Will that he achieves the honors of the altar he will then be the first American born Catholic priest to be named a saint. Those that have read his story learned of the precarious role that Catholics, widows and orphans, and Catholic priests played in the demonizing anti-Catholic rhetoric of the 1800's. In the book you see that his pastoral wisdom was far beyond his years. He was fully prepared to be a priest and was not afraid to envision how much better things could be. Then he steadfastly and prayerfully set out to make a difference, first at St. Mary's Church in New Haven and then parish by parish, council by council. We do need your help. If you are not a member of the Fr. McGivney Guild, you can go on-line to www.kofc.org or get any copy of the "Columbia" magazine, to join. No cost. No obligation. We simply ask for your helpful prayers. If you have not yet read the book, make certain that you do, it should be required reading for every member and his family.

So, again, what is so unique about us? Members have often recanted that by joining the Knights of Columbus, through participation in activities with their brother knights, and conducting

themselves as Catholic gentlemen, this Order becomes a family - faith - safety net. In simple terms the Knights of Columbus is a "family saver" and a "faith preserver." Fr. McGivney wanted council officers who were loyal, virtuous and of high moral character to set the example so that weaker and religiously timid council members would be emboldened when they rubbed elbows. As a result, then, both would be uplifted in spirit. This type of evangelization is the same as Pope Benedict spoke of in his recent trip. He reminded us all to not hide behind our faith, we must live it, express it and evangelize it.

This is exactly the aim and focus of the Supreme Knights book "A Civilization of Love" - "What every Catholic can do to Transform the World." Catholic duties and a moral course of action is challenging these days in the "me" society. The architects of a secular - "Godless" - society attempt to steer everyone away from personal responsibility and morality. Their goal is to replace dependence on God with a dependence on man's civil government. The Supreme Knights' book is courageous and right on target and he explains why and how freedom and truth are so important. The theory he builds is masterful, but begins simply, with each and every one of us. As we work, or play or pray, we must exemplify our Catholic values. This is where our unity of purpose and unity of action will show our Order's true strength. In our individual lives we are often made to feel small by the daunting challenges in the world, but by unity of action Knights banded together can accomplish any goal set before them.

When Catholic families meet at events, they find within the "camaraderie of the council" there is an invigorating stimulus that pours forth from our many programs and events. These activities broaden our horizons. Father McGivney somehow expected that a cohesive fraternal bond would be made and then built upon generation after generation, eventually taking all Catholic people in a decisive new direction of positive Catholic action.

Every time we knights give of our time to aid others in need, we find that we ourselves have personally benefitted more. Each individual effort put forth on behalf of your council, no matter how insignificant it may seem at the time, uplifts the entire Order. The Special Olympics partnership program continues to grow and the benefits are great. With Knights of Columbus support from every jurisdiction and the Supreme support, people with intellectual disabilities are given the opportunity to be all that they can be. When you see the smile and love of a Special Olympic athlete, you see the gratitude of a true champion. When you see that brave athlete holding that medal high in the air you know in your heart, you are in the right place, at the right time, with the right organization, the Knights of Columbus.

The Fr. McGivney and Bishop Daily Vocation Scholarship Programs, the Refund Support Vocation Programs (R.S.V.P.) and all of our local initiatives make us an organization like no other. Last year we contributed \$2.5 million in support of vocations. In the last 25 years we have given well over \$40 million to over 5,000 seminarians. No organization directly does more to support a candidate for the priesthood in spiritual and intellectual formation than the Knights of Columbus. However, we can and need to do much more.

At our College Council Conference held each fall, some of the young men attending are candidates for the priesthood. All are smart and sharp, and those that are called, will be great priests in our future. Those that aren't called will be great Catholic laymen.

Our service as an Order continues to grow with 38 million man hours of service and over \$166 million in charitable contributions. These numbers come from our form #1728 which less than 50% of councils submit. I would also like to acknowledge the outstanding work done by Mississippi for your generosity. In 2006 your donations of nearly \$100 per member is laudable. Making donations of \$633,179 in face of personal devastation shows a true holy Catholic moral compass. Visits to sick and bereaved were counted as 21,125, and we all know that this numbers are significantly higher, just difficult to report.

Our partnership initiative with the Wheelchair Foundation is truly exciting. The Supreme Council has sponsored thousands of wheelchairs that have been given to needy persons around the world and state councils and local councils are following suit.

Our benevolent charity is only eclipsed by our fraternal insurance benefits. I want to pay special tribute to all of our 1,300 field agents and 130 general agents, including General Agent Jerry Woods and his Field Agents. Our professional fraternal counselors are the men that every day gives life and vitality to Fr. McGivney's vision. No Knight of Columbus member's widow should ever have to suffer the indignity of needing, or wanting, or doing without or splitting up the family. We have been protecting Catholic families for generations and our safety net nears the \$70 billion dollar mark. We again are unique among fraternal insurance organizations, in that taking advantage of our outstanding fraternal insurance benefits is optional; every other fraternal in the Fraternal Congress requires purchase of insurance first and that is how one becomes a member. Taking advantage of our fraternal benefits though optional is an extremely wise decision. If you haven't talked with your agent lately about planning for your family's future, please give it very careful consideration. If anyone ever asks you about the Knights of Columbus Insurance all you need to say that it is one of the very best in the industry. Only four insurance providers in North America received the highest ratings from both Standard & Poor's and A.M. Best, as well as certification from the Insurance Marketplace Standards Association for ethical business practices. I remember that when I was state deputy in 1993-95 the supreme knight reported how proud we could be because out of some 1500 insurance companies only 17 received all of the industry's highest ratings. In the face of problems with some insurance companies financial reporting the rating agencies made more stringent criteria for their ratings, many fell off of that elite list, but not the Knights of Columbus. Today, being one of four tells you that the Order lives its Catholic principles and moral values. Our insurance programs are successful because they express our love for our families. You may ask the question, how strong and safe are the Knights of Columbus \$14 billion in investments in the wake of the sub-prime mortgage debacle? Your order analyzed the underwriting of these issues some years ago and saw the great downside potential. Being the prudent moral Catholic stewards of our funds, no money was invested and thus none has been at risk, and no portfolio moves had to be made.

Councils have been instituted in Poland, the first expansion outside of North America since 1905. Our entrance into Poland comes because of our and their steadfast loyalty to the Holy Catholic Church. As Poland has shed the evils of communism they could have invited in any Catholic organization or simply formed their own using many different models. The cardinals and bishops of Poland have long observed the Knights of Columbus and see it that the strong right arm of the church begins with a strong right arm in the parish community is a parish necessity. As self reliance becomes the norm in Poland the parishes hidden for so long now need programs that reach into the heart and soul of the Catholic. One of my enjoyable jobs is to take

care of the cardinals, archbishops and bishops at the Supreme Convention. Cardinal Marcharski told me as I was getting him situated into his room that Columbus is not an important figure in Poland, like here in the United States, but what was intriguing was the positive Catholic fraternity of action.

In his first encyclical "Deus Caritas Est" (God Loves All) Pope Benedict XVI proclaimed that, "Being Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction." And in his second, "Spe Salvi" he stresses that "hope is faith."

"An encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and decisive direction." I ask you, does that not describe every Knights of Columbus meeting or function ever conducted? "Deus Caritas Est" is important as we focus our lives today. The vision of young Catholic priest Father Michael J. McGivney proclaimed "God's Love for all." Father McGivney took a decisive action to instill "hope" in his flock, and that hope" would build a deep and abiding "faith." We Knights of Columbus are truly determined to be that catalyst that brings the spark of hope to all in our communities.

Let us look some Catholic events important to Mississippi Catholics and Knights of Columbus. After the voyage of Columbus in 1492 came the Catholic explorers and missionaries. They documented what they found while staying fairly close to the coast. In 1540 Hernando De Soto began a decade of exploration in this southern region, on what became the dividing line between Spanish and French Territory. Several forts were built. In 1699 Father Antone Davion established a mission in this territory, though it was not long lived. In 1798 the Territory of Mississippi was established by act of Congress, and its boundaries were set in 1817. In this territory Catholic missionary work began with the expeditions of Marquette, La Salle and Iberville. In 1837 the Diocese of Natchez was formed. The first Bishop John Mary Joseph Chanche began to organize the diocese from nothingness with only one priest in his diocese, and was a simple missionary, Father Brogard. In 1842 a cornerstone was laid for the Cathedral and a girl's school was opened. From 1865 to 1868 a young man named Michael McGivney worked in a spoon factory with his father. After his father died he entered the seminary and was ordained in 1877. In 1882 Father Michael McGivney brought men together in the basement of St. Mary's Church in New Haven to form an organization that would become the Knights of Columbus. In 1884 Father McGivney was named pastor of his first parish. In 1890 Father McGivney was laid to rest and the Order had not yet grown past New England. The Order took a decisive step in 1900 in New York City and added the Fourth Degree. The tone of the Knights of Columbus was solidified with this new degree. In 1905 councils started in Jackson, Vicksburg and Natchez. In 1906 the Mississippi State Council was formed. After becoming the first Supreme Master in 1910, John Reddin would call sir knights, "Religiously Devoted" and "Patriotically Proud." Some Catholics wanted to hide from the mean spirited and determined "Know-Nothing" crowd, and decided to keep a low profile, so that they could avoid evangelization encounters, preferring to keep their faith to themselves. Some Catholics wanted to just hide and just be left alone. Where is the charity and love for our neighbor, in that?

A true Knight is not timid about his faith. Courageous Fourth Degree knights are not afraid to parade down the street corner and say, "I am Catholic, and I support the Holy Father, our bishops and priests. It is hard to hide, and say no I am not Catholic, I do not know the Savior," while

dressed in color corps regalia. This thought popped into my head on Palm Sunday, while the Passion was being read. If St. Peter had been wearing feathers on a chapeau, a baldric of national colors sustaining the sword of liberty, a flashy satin cape with tuxedo, bow tie and jewel of office, he could have never denied Jesus. Knights are not afraid and never shrink from the battle for truth and right, and to spread the light of the Gospel.

During World War I decisive knights went to battle as soldiers, sailors and marines and those at home supported the K of C Huts where a message could be sent home, with the motto, "Everybody Welcome, Everything Free." During the depression year's people needed a helping hand. Again, it was the Knights of Columbus that sprang into action because of their community of caring and opened soup kitchens and provided places to sleep. Into World War II Knights were supporters of the brave young men and women fighting for freedom and were ardent sponsors of victory gardens and recycling. The Knights huts in World War I after a lot of political wrangling turned into today's U.S.O.

In 1952 the Knights of Columbus sent to the President Dwight Eisenhower and to each member of the U.S. Congress a resolution, proposing that the words "Under God" be added to the pledge of allegiance to our flag. There was great support from veterans organizations and other fraternal groups. From this decisive and bold action seventeen resolutions sprang forward and President Dwight Eisenhower said as he signed the bill into law on "Flag Day" — June 14, 1954, "these words "under God" will help us to keep constantly in our minds and hearts the spiritual and moral principles which alone give dignity to man, and upon which our way of life is founded." It is imperative to our way of life that they always remain in the pledge.

During these years another Knights of Columbus member was a regular evangelist promoting Catholic truth and light on the radio airwaves and the new medium of television. Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen said: "What the world needs today is a voice that is right. Not when the world is right, but a voice, that is right, when the world is wrong," When you read the Supreme Knights book a "Civilization of Love" you will understand the real need for such a course of action. We Knights of Columbus are that visible event, that stalwart support of the Church, that support the sanctity of life in all of its stages, that support values oriented education and that protect the natural family unit.

Our strength is our unity, unity in purpose and unity in action. What if our forefathers were weak and timid and did nothing and did not participate? Then, they would have allowed the dark and evil triangle forces of the anti-family movement, the anti-life movement, anti-religion forces to strip all dignity from the family, strip life from the innocent and extinguish the flame of faith. This would have allowed the evil of communism to prevail. The Order would have ceased long ago, without a whimper, as have so many others.

The Catholic Church for over two thousand years has been sharing throughout the World, the truth about - - - and proclaiming the Gospel of, - - - our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. The people of these anti-movements oppose any message of "hope" or "faith", or any message of "salvation" and "love" which encourages the natural order of people and of life. These dark forces work tirelessly to persuade the weak of mind and hard of heart that the Catholic Church is opposed to personal freedoms. Knights! Examine - - the - - truth. In the entire history of the Church, she has had only one goal, and that is to build a world of justice, and mercy, freedom and peace. Always remember - - that there are those that wish not only to eliminate the Church

from political influence, but also to eliminate Her, Her bishops and priests, and Her followers -- us -- from being effective in our roles. The Supreme Knight points out in his book, that these so-called rational secular thinkers deem "religion" -- especially Catholicism -- as being socially dangerous. The first evangelizers and seekers of religious freedom that came to the American shores first gave thanks to God, and acknowledged -- His Divine Law -- A HIGHER authority than that of Man. These anti-movements that seek to eliminate hope. Without light and guidance people, especially the weakest, the most vulnerable, become completely --- completely at the mercy of the government, deprived of any protection, any buffer, any mediating agency between himself and the pen of man. Moreover, it is then the whim of man that determines what is right or wrong, good or bad, what is legal and illegal. "If our rights come only from laws written by the pen of man and no absolutes exist. How will people ever understand that Sin is sin? Wrong is wrong. Evil is evil, no matter how socially fashionable or scientifically popular that evil position may be."

Yes, it is absolutely true, "what the world needs today is a voice that is right, not when the world is right, but a voice that is right when the world is wrong." If ever we need a loud statement that says, marriage is between a man and a woman, and no other combination exists, it is today. If ever we need a loud statement that life is sacred in all of its stages from conception to natural death, it is today. If ever a loud statement needs to be made that morality, decency and virtue are an important and necessary family value, it is today. If ever a loud statement needs to be made that all people have a right to a values oriented education, it is today.

Men and their families, want, need, and deserve a culture of hope, a family friendly place to communicate with others who are like-minded, and a Knights of Columbus parish council is such a place. Have you asked an eligible Catholic man and his family to join your council? Once you recruit him, and he joins your council, he will truly have the "Experience of a Lifetime."

Keep up your great works for the Order here in Mississippi; for this is that event, and you, present here today, are the people, which give life a new horizon of hope and decisive direction, to our lay apostolate. It is an "Experience of a Lifetime" for me to represent our great Supreme Knight, Carl A. Anderson at this 102nd Annual convention of the Mississippi State Council Knights of Columbus. God Bless you all and VIVAT JESUS!

People with Intellectual Disabilities

Reverend Clergy, State Officers, Delegates and Brother Knights of the 2008 Knights of Columbus State Convention

While not increasing the amount collected and given to the various facilities in the State of Mississippi, the 2007-08 fiscal year for the Knights of Columbus Foundation, did manage to hold our own. The 38 Councils who participated collected \$97,884.99, which at this time is just \$715.01 less then last year. Some Councils in locations that it is not practical to have a fund drive sent in donations. There were 21 Councils who did not participate, I hope that you may reconsider and join in this worthwhile project that helps our fellow citizens, both children and adults, with disabilities.

The money received, which is distributed on a 75%-25% basis, is distributed to organizations that are Statewide by the Board of Directors at the Mid-Winter meeting. This year the State sent checks totaling \$16,000.00. I realize this amount is somewhat less than 25%, however this is in January and some Council funds have not been received. This amount also enabled the Fund to maintain a balance cushion in case of unexpected expenses.

The total expenses, such as office supplies, fees and insurance amounted to \$768.75. these are the very minimum as we try to be very conservative along these lines.

This past year the "Knights of Columbus Foundation of Mississippi" was officially incorporated in the State of Mississippi. This was accomplished by the work of our State Advocate, David Scott. To Brother David, we say "thanks for making the Foundation' legal.

These figures may change by the April 30 end of our fiscal year. Some Councils may turn in funds this weekend at the State Convention. I will be glad to accept any and with the State Officers present we can handle all the paperwork and issue your check.

- Educate your council, assembly and ladies auxiliary members on the Catholic teachings
 and beliefs on these subjects by asking your pastor to talk at one of your meetings or in
 your adult education program.
- Express to other that you are prolife by wearing a precious feet lapel pin, or by putting a Prolife Bumper Sticker on your vehicles.
- 4. Hold a fundraiser and donate the money to a local prolife group or the Mississippi Memorial Prolife Fund. Since 2001 only 32 councils (58%), 3 assemblies (12%) and 1 ladies auxiliary (5%) have donated to this statewide Knights of Columbus fund. Our goal should be 100% participation. 2007 Mississippi Memorial Prolife Fund Report

Fund Establishment and Function

Delegates assembled at the 96th Annual Convention of the Mississippi State Council in Robinsonville, MS in April 2000 voted to establish a Mississippi Memorial Prolife Fund. This fund will not require any funds from the Mississippi State Council. This fund will function the same way the Bishop R. O. Gerow Memorial Fund for Priest Education does. Councils can contribute money to the fund throughout the year for presentation to the Bishop of Jackson and the Bishop of Biloxi at our annual state convention. Our bishops will distribute the funds to prolife organizations selected by their respective Diocesan offices.

How to Donate

Councils should always make their checks payable to either the Diocese of Biloxi or the Diocese of Jackson and not the Mississippi State Council. These donations should be sent to the Memorial Prolife Fund Chairman for recording purposes. Each year all donations will be listed and acknowledged in the Memorial Prolife Fund Chairman's report in our annual convention minute book and the council and assembly making the largest donation will be awarded a certificate at the Convention Banquet. There are plenty of councils that have not donated to this fund yet, so there is much room for improvement and increased donations to this worthy cause.

The fund provides an excellent way for councils, Knights and others to donate memorial gifts in remembrance of deceased Knights, family members, relatives, and friends.

2008 Statistics

15 Councils, 5 Assemblies, 2 Ladies Auxiliaries and 2 individuals donated to the fund in 2008. Total Donations increased to \$5,226.43 from \$4,761.00 in 2007. Total donation to the Diocese of Biloxi = \$1,075.00. Total donation to the Diocese of Jackson = \$4,151.43.

Vocations Report- Catholic Diocese of Jackson

Worthy Bishops, Worthy State Chaplain, Worthy Supreme Representative, Worthy State Officers, Worthy Delegates and Brother Knights

We currently have 11 men in seminary – at Notre Dame, New Orleans, and St. Joseph in Covington, Louisiana and at Sacred Heart in Wisconsin. This includes our newest seminarian as of January 2008 – Rafael Anguiano from Leon, Mexico.

As this spring semester comes to a close, we will have one man being ordained – Lincoln Dall. All are invited to attend his ordination on Saturday, May 31, 10:30 AM at the Cathedral of St. Peter the Apostle. With at least 4 priests retiring this year in the Jackson Diocese, Lincoln will be greatly needed.

Of the remaining seminarians, two have decided to leave seminary formation in order to further discern God's call. They both are leaving with good evaluations from their seminaries, so the door is open for God to lead them back to the seminary in the future.

We are currently considering an application for a new seminarian, a high school senior from one of the parishes in our Diocese, and hope to have another seminarian arriving this summer from Guatemala.

God-willing, this would give us a total of 9 or 10 seminarians for the fall of 2008.

Fr. Lenin Vargas, Associate Pastor of St. Francis Madison, is Assistant Vocations Director. His main role is to communicate with Bishops and seminarians from other countries (Spanish-speaking) in order to bring more foreign seminarians to our Diocese.

Through the generosity of various Knights of Columbus Councils, all of our current seminarians are being sponsored through the RSVP program. The Diocese pays all of the cost for the seminarians' formation (with the exception of the college-level undergraduate seminarians, who pay some of their tuition themselves) and the Diocese also gives each man a monthly stipend. But the RSVP support is greatly appreciated. It is useful for extra expenses incurred by the seminarians, and it shows the prayerful support of the Knights and helps the seminarians keep in mind the people for whom they are being formed as future shepherds.

Our next Diocesan-wide Vocations project will be a version of "Called by Name" (which we have done in the past) through which parishes are asked to identify those who possibly have a religious vocation so that those individuals can be invited to some sort of regional meetings which will include a mini-retreat, presentations, and a dinner & meeting with the Bishop. In addition to their parish-level participation and prayerful support, the Knights could be called upon to help facilitate the logistics of the regional gatherings.

The Jackson Diocese benefits greatly from the Knights' annual raffle for the benefit of Vocations, which usually brings in approximately \$30,000. This amount is about 1/10 of the total Vocations budget, which includes the salary, travel, and other expenses of the Vocation Director. For the seminarians the budget provides tuition, books, room, board, health insurance, and other assistance. The average annual cost for each seminarian's tuition, books, room, and board is well over \$20,000.

The current financial challenge is to bring long-term stability to the Vocations budget, such as through interest-bearing Foundation Funding. Currently there are a number of Vocations accounts, which are pooled together in the Diocesan Catholic Foundation, but they are not at a sufficient level to provide significant funding. Our next step could be the establishment of a financial development program, hiring professionals if necessary. The goal would be to identify major donors throughout the Jackson Diocese, approach them about making significant contributions, and challenge others to match the contributions, using the program to help all parishioners better understand the costs of seminary education. The very minimum goal of such a Foundation development program would be 1 million dollars; hopefully even more could be realized.

Thanks for your prayers and very generous support. Keep it up. And please continue to pray and look for vocations to the priesthood and religious life from the men and women of our own families and parishes, as Bishop Latino encourages us to do. Though we are still an "American

mission" Diocese, it is time that we take an even greater responsibility for providing ourselves with the clergy and religious we need to understand our faith and celebrate the sacraments, and to provide the same for our children and grandchildren.

At the beginning of the 2007/2008 academic year, the Diocese of Biloxi began with seven seminarians. During the year three men withdrew from formation. The Diocese of Biloxi is left with four active seminarians. During the course of the year, two additional men applied to the diocese as a seminarian. We accepted one of the applicants. Currently, there are four men who are in the interview and application process. We are currently investigating the possibility of recruiting three seminarians from the continent of Nigeria.

God-willing, this would give us a total of 5 to 8 seminarians for the fall of 2008.

At this time, the following men are in formation: Deacon Jose Vazquez, priestly ordination 2008; Ignacio Jimenez, priestly ordination 2011; Ryan McCoy, priestly ordination 2012; Michael Marascalso, priestly ordination 2013; and Esteban Garcia, priestly ordination 2015.

State Membership Chairman's Report

This year I had the honor as serving the Mississippi Jurisdiction as the State Membership Chairman. The most gratifying aspect of my job this past year has been seeing so many new knights start on their path to what I hope is a long career of service to our Church, Priests, Parishes and our communities.

MEMBERSHIP

As in the previous year our yearly goal for each Council was a net increase of four percent. Top Gun Councils were to achieve a net increase of eight percent. No council's net goal would be larger than ten new members with Top Gun requirement of twenty. The top proposer program was continued once again this year.

We once again had hoped to achieve our goal of 400 new Knights this year, but we were only able to achieve a 3.4% percent growth which equated to a gross gain of 220 new Knights. We had 336 men exemplified or reactivated, but lost 116 to suspensions and withdrawals. This lose equated to a 31% percent lose of Brother Knights from the order. These loses were far to high and showed that a greater emphasis needs to be placed on getting out inactive members more

involved in council activities. Of the 59 Councils in the Mississippi Jurisdiction, 13 councils did not add a single new member during the year. On the other hand, 27 councils reached or exceeded their goal. Of that number, 14 councils reached their goals and 13 councils achieved Top Gun status.

Insurance growth this past year was extremely disappointing. For every 3 new insurance members that were brought in, we lost 2 to suspensions, withdrawls or the dropping of their policies. The state only achieved a 0.05% growth rate in insurance members. We must work harder to reverse this trend. Our founder, Father Michael J. McGivney, started the Knights of Columbus to take care of the widows and orphans, but we can do that if we don't get our members to think more about their future and that of their families if they should be called to see our Heavenly Father.

Retention

The Retention of our brother Knights continues to be a problem within the Mississippi Jurisdiction. During the 2007-2008 state fraternal year, for every 3 new members that were brought in to the order within the state, we lost 1 brother. The ratio for insurance members was even worse. For every 3 new insurance members that was recruited, we lost 2 insurance members. While we end up with a net gain in both areas, the loss ratio is still too high. We are losing far too many brother knights.

I encourage all councils and members to work harder to keep these brother knights in the order and get them more active in their councils, parishes and communities. We do not need to be the

stumbling block that causes our brothers to fall. We owe it to them to keep them in the knights and the strong arm of the Church.

New Council Development

During the 2007-2008 there were no new councils started in the state. There are a couple of prospective sites, but at this time no action has been taken.

Round Table Development

While round tables have been a great tool to give the Knights of Columbus a presence in every parish, they are being greatly underutilized in the state. During the past year there were only 16 round tables established and maintained within the state. More attention needs to placed on starting and maintaining the round tables in all the parishes in both Diocese.

In closing I would like to say that we a successful year in recruiting, but we can do better. We all must be more diligent in our recruiting and retention efforts for the Mississippi jurisdiction. We have been given a task by our Lord to bring all of his children closer to him and to help protect them from all the trials and tribulations that we all face. That is what the Knights of Columbus is all about. Let us take this task seriously and work even harder in the upcoming year.
