20% to the Knights of Columbus Foundation of Mississippi

Be It Further Resolved,

That each member of the Knights of Columbus in the Mississippi Jurisdiction is encouraged to support the above listed causes and to promote the Knights of Columbus by purchasing a Knights of Columbus specialty car tag.

After consideration and discussion with proposer, the Committee felt the car tag revenue would be more effective if the number of recipients was reduced. Therefore it recommends the resolution be amended to read:

Resolution No. 6

All Jurisdictions are required to adopt this expansion of the Surge Committee,

Therefore be it resolved,

The Mississippi State Council formally elevates its Pro-Life Committee to be part of the Surge Program with equal benefits and expectations.

The Committee felt since this change was already instituted by Supreme, this resolution is not needed.

That pursuant to Article IV, of the Mississippi State Council By-Laws; per diem expenses for the Delegates, State Officers, District Deputies to the State Council Meeting are hereby set and established to be paid at the rate of \$75.00 per day for two days, plus mileage at \$0.30 per mile one-way, to be based on mileage figures furnished by the Mississippi State Highway Department, and

Be It Further Resolved.

That Past State Deputies in attendance are to be paid a per diem of \$75.00 per day for two days and no allowance for mileage.

Be It Further Resolved,

That, per diem expenses for the State Membership Director, State Program Director, and the six Service Program Directors to the State Council Meeting are hereby set and established to be paid at the rate of \$75.00 per day for two days, plus mileage at \$0.30 per mile one-way, to be based on mileage figures furnished by the Mississippi State Highway Department

Recommendation: On recommendation of the Resolutions Committee, I move Adoption of the amended Resolution 07.

RESOLUTION No 8

Whereas

The members of the Mississippi Knights of Columbus desire to participate in an annual golf tournament to foster fraternity and sportsmanship, and

Whereas

Members from throughout the Jurisdiction participate in the tournament,

Now Therefore Be It Resolved,

That the Mississippi State Council sponsors, at no expense to itself, the official Mississippi State Knights of Columbus Annual Golf Tournament for its membership. The time, date, and place of the tournament will be set at the discretion of the host council, with all business for the tournament to be resolved at a meeting held during the tournament. The chairman of the golf tournament will give a report at the State Convention, and

Be It Further Resolved,

That this State Golf Tournament is not to be confused with nor take the place of the annual golf tournament held in conjunction with State Conventions, and

Be It Further Resolved,

That the Mississippi State Council presents, at no expense to itself and as provided by the appropriate golf association, appropriate trophies to the winners of certain events conducted during the tournament.

Recommendation: On recommendation of the Resolutions Committee, I move Adoption of Resolution 08.

RESOLUTION No 9

Whereas,

The Mississippi Knights of Columbus Forty-Fifth Annual Handicap Bowling Tournament was authorized by resolution at the 105th State Convention held in Jackson, and

Whereas,

Members from throughout the Jurisdiction participated in the tournament, and

It is the express desire by vote of the participants to hold this activity again during the 2010 - 2011 fraternal year,

Now, Therefore be it Resolved,

That the Mississippi State Council sponsors, at no expense to itself, the official Mississippi State Knights of Columbus Annual Handicap Bowling Tournament for its membership, said tournament to carry the official sanction of the United States Bowling Congress. The time, date, and place of the tournament will be set at the discretion of the host council, with all business for the tournament to be resolved at a meeting held during the tournament. The chairman of the bowling tournament will give a report at the State convention, and

Be It Further Resolved,

That the Mississippi State Council presents, at no expense to itself and as provided by the bowling association, appropriate trophies to the winners of certain events conducted during the tournament.

Recommendation: On recommendation of the Resolutions Committee, I move Adoption of Resolution 09.

Recommendation: On recommendation of the Resolutions Committee, I move Adoption of Resolution 01.

RESOLUTION No 11

Whereas

The Knights of Columbus have always supported priests and seminarians, and

Wherea

A priest who is more familiar with the Knights of Columbus will be a stronger promoter of our order, and

Whereas

Seminarians are the source of future priests our dioceses, and

Wheren

Seminarians usually do not have outside employment for a source of income, and

Wherea

It would be mutually advantageous for seminarians to attend the State Convention,

Now, Therefore Be it Resolved,

That the Mississippi Jurisdiction of the Knights of Columbus establish a fund to cover the expenses of any qualified seminarian in the Mississippi Jurisdiction who wishes to attend the State Convention, and

Be It Further Resolved,

That this fund be established and maintained solely by voluntary contributions of members and councils, and

Be It Further Resolved,

That the State Officers have the authority to disburse the necessary funds upon a request by any qualified seminarian.

RESOLUTION No 12

Whereas.

The State Convention provides a wonderful opportunity for knights and their families to share fraternity, renew friendships and meet state and religious leaders, and

Some members do not attend the convention even when it is in easy driving distance because of financial or time concerns, and

Many of these members are up and coming leaders, new to the Order who could be energized by the convention atmosphere, widows or seniors who wish to come for the day, attend a mass, visit friends and go home before the evening activities, and

Some ladies attend the Memorial Mass and the Ladies Luncheon but would like to be official convention attendees and receive packets, and

Whereas.

The Convention Committee wishes to make all these individuals welcome and attract them to the Convention, even if it's for the day, particularly in the more densely populated areas of the State,

Now Therefore, Be It Resolved,

The Convention Committee will include an option for a non-delegate registration fee of \$10 that entitles the person to be a registered convention attendee, receive a name tag, gift and the same benefits as other registered attendees,

Be it Further Resolved,

This fee does not apply to delegates or non-delegates who select the full package to include both dinners.

Recommendation: The committee felt this would be charging members for something they are entitled to, and were unable to find merit. Therefore, at the recommendation of the committee, I move rejection.

RESOLUTION No 13

Article X, Section1 provides for Amendments to the Bylaws of the Mississippi State Council of the Knights of Columbus, and

Whereas

Article VI, Section 4 of the Bylaws of the Mississippi State Council of the Knights of Columbus provides:

Per Capita Tax: The per capita tax of the Mississippi State Council shall be the amount per member per year approved a the last State Council meeting on which a Per Capita Tax Resolution was adopted, payable one-half on August 1 each year based upon the membership figures of July 1 and the other one-half payable on February 1 each year based upon the membership figures of January 1 in accord with Section 118(c) and (d) of the Supreme Council by-laws, provided. Inactive insurance members as described in Section 69(b) of the Charter Constitution and Laws of the Knights of Columbus will be assessed and credited State Per Capita Tax using the same procedure as does the Supreme Council with their per capita assessments and credits. However, the Per Capita Tax may be changed by two thirds (2/3) vote of the State Council Meeting or as otherwise provided in these By-Laws.

Whereas,

It is not feasible for the State Council to assess inactive insurance members using the same procedure as does the Supreme Council with their per capita assessments and credits,

Now. Therefore Be it Resolved.

Article VI, Section 4 of the Mississippi State Council Bylaws is hereby amended as follows:

Per Capita Tax: The per capita tax of the Mississippi State Council shall be the amount per member per year approved a the last State Council meeting on which a Per Capita Tax Resolution was adopted, payable one-half on August 1 each year based upon the membership figures of July 1 and the other one-half payable on February 1 each year based upon the membership figures of January 1 in accord with Section 118(c) and (d) of the Supreme Council Bylaws. However, the per capita tax may be changed by two thirds (2/3) vote of the State Council Meeting or as otherwise provided in these Bylaws.

Recommendation: On recommendation of the Resolutions Committee, I move Adoption of Resolution 13.

RESOLUTION No 14

Article VI, Section 4 of the Mississippi State Council By-Laws provides in part that the per capita tax of the Mississippi State Council shall be the amount per member per year approved at the last State Council meeting on which a Per Capita Tax Resolution was adopted, and

Now, Therefore Be It Resolved,

That pursuant to Article VI, Section 4 of the Mississippi State Council By-Laws, the per capita tax of the Mississippi State Council for regular Insurance and Associate members shall be Eight Dollars (\$8.00) per member per year, and

Be it Further Resolved,

That per capita tax on Honorary members shall be Two Dollars and Seventy cents (\$2.70) per member per year, both payable on half (1/2) on August 1st of each year, based on the membership totals of July 1 and the other on half (1/2) payable on February 1 each year based on the membership totals of January 1, in accordance with Section 118 (c) and (d) of the Charter. Constitution and Laws of the Order.

Be It Further Resolved,

That each council shall not be assessed the state per capita tax for any of its Honorary Life, Disabled and Inactive members.

Recommendation: The committee agreed with the intent to have these figures restated, therefore, on recommendation of the Resolutions Committee, I move Adoption of Resolution 14.

We discussed three major areas concerning membership recruitment and retention. Those areas were problems faced by councils, successful practices of councils and the needs of all councils.

Problems

- 1) The cyclical cleansing of Council Members, behind on dues This seems to happen every so often, especially when new Financial Secretaries take over. The committee was in total agreement that this was one of those years. Trustee involvement is essential in curving these cycles. In councils that do not have these purging cycle, Trustees monitor the rolls and recommend timely contact of delinquent members. This is done annually and not put off for down years. This gives the council a chance to offset the drop in membership with new recruiting.
- 2) The lack of participation by current members This is a problem faced by councils of all sizes. Many times new members are brought into the council and then left to basically fend for themselves. Councils have got to develop more programs for the families of these new members. The most successful councils get the families involved in activities and this gives the new members and even a lot of the older members a reason to get involved with the council and parish.
- 3) Lack of a full time priest When councils are served by a priest that has several parishes or mission churches to serve it makes it more difficult to get the continuous support that the council needs to flourish. This can be particularly a problem when the priest is a military priest and so much time is spent serving the needs of our troops.

Successe

- 1) Recruiting Family Members councils reported on the success they have had with recruiting family members of new members. This was a target area stressed by these councils. A new member was asked to give names of fathers, brothers, uncles, cousins, etc and that may be interested in joining. The member was then involved in recruiting these people.
- 2) Hispanic Recruiting The growing Hispanic community has opened up recruiting possibilities for many councils. This year's successful councils have tapped into this resource. There are obstacles such as language, the unwillingness to fill out the paperwork, but these can be overcome.

Retention

1) Shining Armor Award – More councils need to stress the Shining Armor award to their new members. Some of the greatest recruitment successes have been from councils that have pushed the program. It is a great way to get the new members involved in the council and therefore make them better knights. Involved Knights "STAY KNIGHTS".

Mississippi Memorial Prolife Fund Report Fund Establishment and Function

Delegates assembled at the 96th Annual Convention of the Mississippi State Council in Robinsonville, MS in April 2000 voted to establish a Mississippi Memorial Prolife Fund. This fund does not require any funds from the Mississippi State Council. This fund functions the same way the Bishop R. O. Gerow Memorial Fund for Priest Education does. Councils can contribute money to the fund throughout the year for presentation to the Bishop of Jackson and the Bishop of Biloxi at our annual state convention. Our bishops will distribute the funds to prolife organizations selected by their respective Diocesan offices.

How to Donate

Councils should always make their checks payable to the Mississippi State Council, Knights of Columbus. These donations should be sent to the State Treasurer or given to him or Memorial Prolife Fund Chairman for recording purposes. All donations will be deposited in the Mississippi State Council checking account and the State Treasurer will write checks to the Diocese of Biloxi and the Diocese of Jackson. Each year all donations will be listed and acknowledged in the Memorial Prolife Fund Chairman's report in our annual convention minute book and the council and assembly making the largest donation will be awarded a certificate at the Convention Banquet. There are plenty of councils that have not donated to this fund yet, so there is much room for improvement and increased donations to this worthy cause.

The fund provides an excellent way for councils, Knights and others to donate memorial gifts in remembrance of deceased Knights, family members, relatives, and friends.

2009 Statistics

11 Councils, 4 Assemblies, 22 Ladies Auxiliaries and 3 individuals donated to the fund in 2009.

Total statewide donations increased to \$6,166.80 from \$5,226.43 in 2008.

Total donations to the Diocese of Biloxi were \$1,345.00.

Total donations to the Diocese of Jackson were \$4,821.80.

2010 Statistics

26 Councils, 8 Assemblies, 1 Ladies Auxiliary and 1 individual donated to the fund in 2010

Total statewide donations increased to \$10,728.60 from \$6,166.80 in 2009.

Vocations Committee Report

As we begin this report, we do so with an "attitude of gratitude". On behalf of Bishop Latino, the people of our diocese and our seminarians, we must thank you greatly for supporting our vocations program as all of our councils are doing. Special thanks go to those councils who support our seminarians through the RSVP program. Currently, there are 7 councils participating; and all of the seminarians who need support are

We are grateful, too, to those councils who have supported the seminarians who are leaving formation – Greg Davidson and Rusty Vincent – and we want those councils to know that their support was not wasted. Both men are simply engaged in the intense discernment that seminary entails, and neither of them could say that a lack of support from the parishioners of our diocese has influenced their decision. I hope that one or both of them will return to us. (And already those councils who were supporting these men have asked us about picking up someone else.) And if other councils want to get involved, that is always possible, since we try to spread the support around evenly, as far as amount; and sometimes this takes more than one council to support one seminarian.

Our main goal, lately, has been to identify a "Parish Vocation Contact" in every single parish in the diocese - a lay person who will be assisting the pastors and pastoral ministers in three ways concerning vocations: promoting awareness, giving their fellow parishioners opportunities to pray for vocations, and inviting specific men and women to consider a vocation to the priesthood and religious life. Even better, some of those "PVC's" have formed small committees to help them (such as St. Alphonsus in McComb). We really think these PVC's and their committees will become the strongest way to promote vocations, other than the priests inviting men to the priesthood themselves. The PVC's enable us to get the word out more quickly than going through the pastors, since the pastors already have so much on their plates. But we always encourage the PVC's to work closely with their pastors and pastoral ministers. Most of the parishes have a PVC, but we would like to have one for every parish. The Knights of Columbus could help this effort by simply teaming up with the parish PVC. (In some cases the Knights of Columbus Vocation representative is already the parish PVC). This way, when we send out information concerning vocations to all of the parishes, whatever those PVC's receive will also come to the awareness of the Knights of Columbus, who are already interested in promoting vocations

Please keep praying earnestly for vocations! Take it to Jesus the next time you make a visit to Adoration before the Blessed Sacrament. If we truly believe that the Eucharist is the "source and summit of the Christian life," as our catechism states, then we still have an absolutely vital need for priests, especially in the celebration of the Eucharist and to assist Bishop Latino as fellow shepherds, even with the many good lay people who are coming forward to be trained for leadership in our parishes.

The cost of seminary formation for these men is a tremendous challenge. It can cost our diocese over \$12,000 each year to educate one seminary college student (he or his family pays an additional \$12,000) and well over \$30,000 to educate one theology student (the diocese funds the entire cost of graduate theology studies and provides a monthly stipend and health insurance). The contribution made each year from the Bishop R. O. Gerow Memorial Fund provides much needed assistance in funding our seminarian education.

We currently have 9 seminarians. After Deacon Scott Thomas is ordained to the priesthood this June, it will be at least 2 years before we have another ordination. Next fall after Deacon Thomas' ordination, we will have 8 seminarians. We are currently in the discussion phase with several young men who are interested in applying, though at this time, we are not sure if any of them will be ready to enter by this fall.

Council 802 Meridian

These are some of the projects of Meridian Council 802, Knights of Columbus. This is our history.

Church Activities

The following Church Activities were done on an ongoing basis for the Council Year from July, 2009 through May 2010:

- Quarterly Communions were held in June, September, December and February.
 Members and their families sit in the front pews of the church and receive Communion as a body.

- On April 3, our council sponsored a Brunch for the RCIA program for all incoming members and their families.
- On April 8, several members of our council help to set up tables and chairs at St. Patrick Family Life Center in preparation for the St. Patrick School Drawdown.
- On April 22, our council hosted a Cookie and Cake reception for our Confirmation class and their families.
- On May 1, our council prepared and served approximately 240 lunches for our First Communion members and their families and friends.
- During the month of May, members of the council lead the Rosary before each Mass at both St. Patrick and St Joseph churches.
- On May 23, our council will help with the Pentecost Mass to be held at one of our local lakes.

Council Activities

We had several projects scheduled for the 2009-2010 year. The first was the Memorial Day Picnic on May 24th We had twelve people signup for the horseshoe tournament. John Maloney Jr. took 1 splace and Jim Romano took second. Thanks to all the guys who took part. I want to thank Richard Fleming and Tommy Beeman for making the hamburger patties. I would also like to thank Ed Shamp for pressure washing the slab. I cannot forget the cooks John Bennett, Ed Shamp and Jim Romano for their great culinary powers. They also handmade the jalapenio bites. There

were around 79 people there. Labor Day Picnic was our second event. I counted 125 people, but I probably missed a few. This is the largest crowd I have seen at an outdoor picnic since I have been in Meridian (2000). It was nice to see all of the little ones running around and playing. We can't put on something like this without a lot of helping hands in the back ground. I would like to thank the following people: Tom Beaman and Doctor Fleming (food preparation), Ed Shamp, Tau Iosia, and Jim Romano (the cooks), John Kasper for pressure washing the picnic area, Bob Leo and Chris Foster (picnic area prep), the CYM, there was a lot of them who came to set up games and play with the children. I can't forget those who helped with cleanup: Doc, Bob Leo, and Jan and John Kasper washed all the utensils. I would be remising if I didn't thank Tripp Ward for bringing the Moon Bounce, which the children really seemed to enjoy. Then we on Tuesday March 9th we held our annual Pool Tournament. We started at 7:30 and had 10 entries. There was Bob Leo. Chris Foster, Tripp Ward, Ed Shamp, Pete Vining, Mouise Richards, John Maloney Sr., John Bennett, Joe Gomez and me P. J. Carter. A good time was had by all. The winner for the second year in a row was Tripp Ward. Second place was shared by Mouise Richards and John Maloney Sr. After our Labor Day Picnic it was decided that we could use some new playground equipment targeted for 7 year olds and younger. We purchased one for around \$5,000. The playground equipment construction was held on Saturday March 20th Several Knights (Tripp Ward, Brad Parsons, Bob Leo, John Graupman and John Kasper) We also had 5 of the Sr. CYM members showed up to help (Sara and William Billups, Samantha Colyer and Brittany Johnson, John Joseph Maloney).

Pro-Life Activities

During the 2009-2010 fraternal year, pro-life activities were conducted throughout the year. These activities were tied to important dates in the pro-life movement and were public events conducted by the Knights. We displayed a pro-life billboard on one of the busiest highways in our area during the months of January and February. During the months of October (the month of the Holy Rosary) and January (to commemorate the Roe v Wade decision) the Knights led the rosary before all of the weekend Masses at our two churches. We financially support and physically participate in the fund raising drives for the Center for Pregnancy Choices in Meridian. We actively participate in the State pro-life rally at the Capitol in Jackson. We continue to support and donate to the Knights of Columbus Mississippi Pro-Life Statewide Fund. At all of our Council meetings, we remember the unborn in our prayers.

Community Activities

The Community Activities Program operates every month during our Council year. Beginning in July we continue with our monthly East Mississippi State Hospital Nursing Center Visitations. With a mere \$50.00 budgeted for this particular activity we gather at the Nursing Center with anywhere from six to twelve Knights to spend an hour, or so, with patients at this facility one night each month. During our December visit we provide gifts, entertainment and, who else but, good old Saint Nick himself. In September we started our support for the Kairos prison ministries program with a donation of \$200.00, to be followed by two other similar donation throughout the year for a total of \$600.00. A group of men who visit the local state prison, along with the leadership of a Brother Knight, bring the word of God through Christian outreach through this program. In November we supported Operation Reindeer with a gift of \$100.00, a local group in conjunction with the Lauderdale County Mental Health Association, which provided gifts for needy children of prison inmates. In the spirit of Christmas we donated \$100.00 to the Wesley House and \$100.00 to the Salvation Army Angel Tree program to help with gifts

for needy children and families. Our Knights manned two Salvation Army Kettles at a local WalMart for a total of 30 hours for this worth charity. In May our Knights once again answered the call for charity by collecting \$640.00 for the Knights of Columbus annual Mental Health fund raiser by conducting a Tootsie-Roll drive at the local WalMart. Our Council donated \$100 to the Childhood Leukemia Foundation and another \$100 to the Mississippi Make a Wish Foundation. We ended our fiscal year by awarding our annual Msgr. John J. Burns Award to Dr. Ronnie Purvis for his commitment to several charitable community programs in Meridian during the 2009 calendar year. Many of our Knights are involved within the community in everything from Boy Scouts of America to prison ministries to the arts with countless hours of involvement. Council 802 doesn't just believe in charity, we practice it, through our community.

Youth Activities

As Knights of Columbus members, we influence the youth of our community by becoming involved with them through supporting St. Patrick School, Catholic Youth Organizations, and Boy Scouts, and also by creating Knights of Columbus activities in which the youth of our community can participate. Every month, during our Council year, the Youth Activities Program operates with activities beginning with the newborn to the high scholar. We start with our Santa Visit to the three main hospitals. Santa brings toys and Christmas cards from the Knights of Columbus to those newly born and those little tots who are stuck in the hospital on Christmas Eve. For the slightly older tots we have our resident Easter Bunny hide hundreds of plastic eggs (over 1000) filled with goodies and prizes for an afternoon of fun and games searching for hidden eggs. The golden egg gets a grand prize. St. Patrick School tots are involved with a Columbus Day Poster contest on Columbus Day. In fact we support our local Saint Patrick Catholic School with this and many other activities. We have a Creative Contraption Contest for the 3rd thru 6th grade. Here each child is given an identical bag of gadgets, screws, sticks, string, clips, cotton, etc. The students use their creativity to make a contraption using the gadgets supplied. A prize is awarded to the top three winners who show creativity without any obvious parental control. We support the school with a \$10,000 scholarship fund and other funds that may be needed throughout the year.

We assist the school with their fundraisers: the Haunted House and the Irish Festival. We, also, maintain the School's web site.

As our youth become older they join the CYM (Catholic Youth of Meridian organization). We support them going to Search and the State CYO Conventions by donations and by placing ads in the Convention's Program Guide. We have a matching fund of \$500. We match funds they rose to fund their own budget. This is by no means a one-way street. To foster their growth and leadership, we have our CYM youths participate with us. They help us with many functions such as Santa's Visit, the Easter Egg Hunt, bell ringing for the Salvation Army, etc.

Our Knights and their families have helped serve over 3800 five-dollar dinners during the year to raise money for PSR (Parish School of Religion) education. We also support our local Scouts with donations to the Pinewood Derby Race, camping trips, and Scout Blue and Gold Banquets. Six of our Brother Knights work with the Scouts as Cub and Boy Scout Leaders. We hire the Scouts to help us at various functions to foster a good work ethic. We also sponsor a Free Throw Contest, promote World Youth Day, participate in

Special Olympics, and sponsor Drug Awareness through a Drug and Alcohol Awareness Poster Contest.

As Grand Knight I am proud to have served my fellow man and Catholic Community. I want to thank all my Directors who have contributed to our continuing success in the oldest council in the state of Mississippi. They have supported me and all that we do as a council. We have attempted to include the widows of our deceased members in all that we do as Knights. Fr. McGivney would approve. Thanks to all the State Officers that have given great guidance and inspiration to all the Councils in the state. God, Family, Country. Need I say more?

At the beginning of the 2009-2010 fraternal years I approached the council with this statement, "Brothers, we have had many programs for church, family, council, youth and community and spent many man hours in accomplishing their success, but in my opinion, we are going in the wrong direction." I received some very odd looks, and some open mouth gasps. I went on to say, "When you joined the Knights of Columbus, what was the first degree based on? CHARITY!! Charity is not by money alone but by good deeds and caring. This is the way I want our Council to go." I then proceeded to set up our goal for Charity and Pro-Life for the coming year and asked my brothers to spent their many hours working in this direction along with the other activities for the year. I established a Charity and a Pro Life Committee.

With great thanks to my Brother Knights, here are some of the things our Council accomplished this year:

Charity

Father Rick Phipps, Pastor of Christ the King Church in Jackson, called and asked if our Council could help with some windows for the Sister Thea Bowman Catholic School. The fire department and the education department of the City would not allow him to open the school because the windows in the classrooms did not pass inspection. If there was a fire or other disaster, no one could escape from the windows. Neither the Church, nor the school could afford to replace the old windows, without new windows, the school could not open. An email went out to our Knights and they responded whole-heartily to this project. They showed up at the school on a Saturday morning with all their power tools and muscle ready to work. In one day's time we had the windows replaced. The next day we painted the new window frames. The school could open on schedule.

While we were at the school, we discovered that the school needed school supplies and their funds were limited. We then set up a drive for school supplies and/or donations for this school. We collected two truck loads of supplies plus \$3,110.00 in funds for the school to buy whatever else they needed.

The Council obtained a motorized wheel chair to be used by handicapped individuals. The first person to use this chair was the widow of a Brother Knight.

We sat up a hot line for our deceased Knight's widows, families of Knights in the military service and our elderly Knights. So far, our Knights have able to respond to their calls in a matter of minutes. We have repaired electrical problems, moved heavy

furniture, repaired a refrigerator, repaired a computer, cut trees, and cut, trimmed and removed tree limbs and branches after a snow storm. The best part is there was no cost or hardship to these ladies and our Brother Knights.

Brother Mark Beyea is stationed in Afghanistan. He asked if our Council could help get 12 children in Afghanistan some soccer uniforms. Our Knights went to work, obtained the needed uniforms and got them mailed to Afghanistan.

We took 800 hamburger buns to Our Daily Bread to help feed their needy. Our Daily Brad is part of Sacred Heart Church in Canton where Fr. Kevin Slattery is the priest. Through this we learned of the Hispanic Center of Canton, also a ministry of the Sacred Heart Church. Our Council installed metal shelving for the panty area of The Hispanic Center and labeled each section in order to organize the food. We then divided the Council into various food groups and sent out a request to our Knights. Once again our Knights responded. We filled the shelves with food for the poor. Other donations from our Knights were clothes, shoes and suits.

At Thanksgiving we took 22 baskets of food to the poor. Ten turkeys were also delivered to other needy families. A refrigerator was given to the Hispanic Center.

Our Council gave \$490.00 to the relief effort in the Philippines.

December brought on the Christ In Christmas with the selling of Religious Christmas Cards and collecting book and money for gift cards for Saint Anne's children in Carthage, MS. Food and Clothing were also sent to Saint Anne's to help the needy families

Our Council adopted a family of seven for Christmas. Each member of the family was adopted by a Knight.

We are happy to report that 1,057 children were adopted for the holiday season. What a charity effort our Knights accomplished.

Dr. Paul's computer went out. Our Council had it repaired for him.

A man came to the Church asking for clothes. Our Council collected shirts, pants, socks and underwear for him.

Pro Life

Our next goal was to donate funds to Pro Life organizations in the Jackson - Madison area. Grillin' for Life, or now as it is called Sanctity for Life, is a Kansas City Barbeque competition between the Knights of Columbus councils, professional teams and backyard grillers. All proceeds were distributed to Pro Life & the Special Olympics.

A cross committee was set up to make 154 crosses. A banner was made that says, "The 154 crosses represent the number of unborn deaths per hour in this great nation, United States of America. May God have mercy on us." The crosses were placed on the grounds of St. Francis of Assisi Church in Madison.

A candlelight human rosary in the shape of the rosary was formed. Everyone received a candle and stood in the shape of the rosary. As the Rosary was said, the candles were lit, one by one until the whole rosary was lit. The Rosary was led by our Council Warden, preceded by a prayer from our Parish Priest.

Other Activities

Our Council was responsible for the two largest fundraises for our Parish, The Cajun Fest and the Starry Night Gala. We raised a total of \$97,000.00 for the new St. Anthony Elementary School from these two events.

We work in Prison Ministries. We collected underwear, t shirts and toiletry items for the Hinds County Detention Center.

We conducted a blood drive for our Parish.

During Lent we led a Rosary every Friday and served a meatless meal to the Parish.

We organized a golf tournament. The proceeds from this tournament went to Seminarian Education.

For the youth of the Parish we held, kite flying contests, pumpkin carving contests, swim parties, picnics, back to school parties, soccer and basketball contests.

We cooked and served the food for the St. Joe High School Drawdown.

Installation of officers for the 2009 – 2010 fraternal year was conducted by Philip Jabour, Worthy District Deputy. Our council continues to grow in number just as our home parish, St. Joseph – Gluckstadt, continues to grow. At July 1, 2009, our membership number was 87. At July 1, 2010, we were at 95. We are getting new, young men – husbands and fathers – as active members. We are also welcoming men transferring to the area and to our parish from other councils, locally and from out-of-state. We achieved Star Council again for the year and expect to continue to do so each year.

St. Joseph Parish is undertaking the construction of a new sanctuary and associated structures for the growing congregation, reflecting the growing population in Madison County. Our Sunday Masses are generally overcrowded in our small 1970's facility. Fr. Kevin Slattery and Fr. Onwu Akpa provide our community with excellent liturgies, homilies and pastoral care.

Our council participates in numerous activities, focusing on vocation support and on prolife, family issues. We support, financially and with prayer, seminarian Adam Nobles, who is presently in his third year philosophy curriculum at St. Joseph Abbey and Seminary College in St. Benedict, Louisiana. We provide as much assistance as possible to any family-support issue identified to us. We are convinced that our parish is home to a number (unknown at the moment) of future vocations to the priesthood and religious life. The seeds are planted; we are diligently doing our best to nurture them.

Our parish holds an annual German Fest, highlighting the origins of the community originally settled by German-descendant families from Illinois, Indiana and other Midwestern states at the beginning of the 20th century. KC members take prominent part in the festival planning and work.

We have held pancake breakfasts. Lenten fish suppers, and other activities with the funds going to priest education. Our members participate in various ministries during Mass. We have KC Corporate Mass each quarter and lead the Rosary before each Mass during

April and October. We hosted the Silver Rose Memorial Mass in October, led Stations of the Cross one Wednesday during Lent, and participate in First Friday Eucharistic Adoration. One of our members is the designated alter server trainer for the parish.

We participate in the Tootsie Roll Drive each year, sponsor a Blood Drive each year, assist with fundraisers and other efforts for Holy Child Jesus School in Canton, and assist in an annual pro-life memorial ceremony in St. Joseph's Cemetery. The Tootsie Roll Drive funds have been sent to a team we sponsor in the Challenger League, providing sports-related experiences for developmentally-challenged people.

Several members take time each second Saturday of the month and pray the Rosary in front of the abortion facility in Jackson. Knights placed 154 crosses on the front lawn of the church for a month as a witness to the genocide of abortion in America. We raised money from parishioners for Birthright of Jackson.

We have many military veterans buried at St. Joseph's Cemetery. Our Memorial Day Mass in the cemetery is explicitly to honor them and all veterans of service to our country. We put American flags on the veteran's graves at that time.

In council activities, we have hosted first degree exemplifications, attended the School of Columbianism and conducted membership drives. We recognize a family of the month each month and have entered a member into the Family of the Year. Council members participate on degree teams with members from other councils. Our council does not presently have a degree team of its own, but several members have expressed interest in hosting one at our council. We appreciate the camaraderie with our neighboring councils in District 6 and the mutual support we share.

Our youth groups are growing. One of our members has been very generous with his time, as has his wife and children, in leading and supporting the youth. We have provided financial support to our confirmation classes and have provided financial support for the groups to go on summer trips. We have sponsored mission trips for individual youths at times.

We have much for which to be thankful at St. Joseph Parish and at our council. We have a strong group of Catholic men who are striving to live by the guiding hand of God. Our parish ranks are growing with wonderful, committed families. We feel the warm winds of a renewal of faith, guided by the Holy Spirit, upon our community. Our council continues to grow in size, quality and confidence. We are heartened by the leadership of Pope Benedict XVI, our bishops, priests and religious, and the strong resurgence of authentic Catholic teaching. STATE OFFICER REPORTS

State Deputy's Report

Reverend Bishops, Worthy State Chaplain, Worthy Supreme Rep Daniel Baker, Fellow State Officers, Worthy Delegates to the 106th State Convention, Brother Knights all:

Happy Easter! I hope that you and your families had a good one.

The Supreme Council has named this the Year of the Volunteer, and our Pope has named it the Year of the Priest. It is appropriate that we observe this Knights of Columbus year with special recognition of the most significant volunteers among us, our priests. Let us once again show our appreciation to the priests among us this morning and thank them for all their efforts on our behalf.

I would also like to say a special thank-you to our district deputies for all their effort during the past year. Your state officers worked as a team. I thank them, and especially IPSD Danny Lechner, for their dedicated work and good counsel.

It has been an honor to serve as your State Deputy for this past year. It has been a year of things good and bad. A physician calls one of his patients and says, "Bob, I've got some good news and some bad news for you." Well, let's have the good news first," says Bob. "Well," the physician says. "those tests we did the other day indicate that you have only 24 hours to live." My God," cries Bob, "that's the good news? What could the bad news possibly be?" "Well," says the physician. "I was supposed to call you yesterday."

My news is, perhaps, not as bad as that bad news, and the good is certainly better. First, the bad news. Mid-way into our fraternal year, our State Warden Bill Waggonner took a position out of State and had to resign his office. We will miss him. In accord with the Order's By-Laws, the State Officers appointed our State Membership Director, Noel Aucoin, to fill that position until a new Warden can be duly elected.

This year, our Roundtable quota was 45. As of this week, we had only 18. We can certainly do better than this. Mississippi claimed as many as 46 Roundtables not too many years ago. Those parishes and many others are still here. We can and should reach out to them and establish a Knights of Columbus presence in each parish in the State to assist our priests in every way we can.

Our membership goal for this year is to bring 430 new Knights into the Order. As of this week, we have brought in 189, only 44% of the goal. What is more significant, however, is that we lost 150 through suspensions. When we account for withdrawals and deaths, our membership has shrunk by 110 compared to last year. There are fewer men in the Mississippi Jurisdiction this year than last year. We can do better in membership as well.

Timely submission of forms, especially the important Form 1728, the Report of Fraternal Activities, is a continuing problem. However, I can say that as of today, we are only one council short of 100% submission. Thanks to all you Grand Knights, Financial Secretaries and District Deputies for your efforts in getting these forms submitted.

We started this year with 59 active councils. However, Council 6555 in Shelby was consolidated with Council 5556 in Cleveland. As you might know, the Shelby council

and the surrounding area has been having difficulties for several years, and this merger was not unexpected.

As far as good things in the Jurisdiction, there are many items to report. We are about to start a new council in Poplarville, and it should be underway before the end of June. This will bring us back to 59 councils. In addition, there is work underway in at least one additional area.

One of the strengths of our Jurisdiction is our ceremonials. I would like to give a special thanks to the members of our First, and especially our Second and Third degree teams, and to our ceremonial chairs, PSD's Tom Chady and Rich Lieding, for the time they put in to insure a first-rate experience to our members.

I mentioned above that this is the Year of the Priest. Several councils have held appreciation dinners for their priest and religious. At least one Council made use of the Prayer for Priests distributed by Supreme, distributing these before Mass and leading the prayer after Mass. Many councils participated in the RSVP program and supported one or more seminarians, not only financially, but with their prayers and letters of support. In June, one of the members of the Starkville Council, Deacon Scott Thomas, will be ordained. Mississippi has a history of supporting the education of future priests through the Bishop Gerow Fund. Last year, we gave our bishops almost \$93,000 with 47 of the 59 councils involved. Our Bishop Gerow chairman, Don Cox, will let us know this year's results later.

The primary principle of our Order is Charity, and we have done an outstanding job in that area. In September 2009, a typhoon hit the Philippines. Later, in January 2010, a devastating earthquake struck Haiti. Both countries were, and still are, in severe distress. Many Mississippi councils provided financial support for both of these disasters. We are called to assist the poor and the most vulnerable in our society. You have done that with programs to raise money and materials for local food pantries and supplied the manpower to work there. You have held numerous fundraisers and collected materials to support local pregnancy crisis centers. You have sponsored programs to pray for an end to abortion. Several councils sponsored pro-life programs for the parish and the local community with invited speakers from state-wide pro-life organizations. This past year, our Program for People with Intellectual Disabilities (PID Program or "Tootsie Roll Drive") brought in about \$71,000 which was distributed to organizations throughout the State to help people with physical and mental disabilities.

Councils have sponsored many excellent programs in the six activity areas of the Knights. You have visited local hospitals and held Christmas parties for the children there. You visited veterans' homes and retirement homes, and prepared a special meal for the residents, or just spent some time with them talking and sharing stories. You distributed Christmas baskets, helping make a happy time for many families that would otherwise have had little to eat and no presents for the children. You helped homeless veterans on the coast by collecting and distributing personal hygiene products. You celebrated family life with cookouts and campouts. You supported your parishes by raising money for the building projects, or by doing the building yourselves. You helped the widows of departed brother Knights by fixing up their homes.

You did all these and many more activities not because you had to, not because you were looking for some reward, but because they were the right thing to do. Because if you did not do them, no one else would. Albert Einstein said, "Try not to become a man of success, but a man of value." You have proven yourselves men of value. I congratulate you.

State Advocate's Report

My Brother Knights,

It has been my privilege to serve as your State Advocate this year. I am pleased to report that we have encountered no major problems that needed to be resolved with this office.

Some of the areas that have been a focus involved assisting Councils with bylaw questions, council assets, and how to register their Employer ID (or EIN) with Supreme, so they will be in compliance and eligible to file their 990 tax report.

On the subject of tax exempt status, all councils who have filed their EIN with Supreme are included on its list of registered Councils and therefore are under its 501C8 Tax Exempt Non-Profit umbrella. This exemption applies only to income tax, not sales tax.

The most recent initiative from Supreme is in the area of Identity Theft. As a result, all Financial Secretaries and Comptrollers are required to remove or delete social security numbers from paper or electronic files.

I encourage every Grand Knight to request a copy of the latest Financial Secretary's Handbook. It contains excellent tidbits of information, clear and concise procedures and a very helpful FAQs section.

The highlight of the year, outside of this convention of course, was being selected as one of your delegates to the Supreme Convention in Phoenix, It was my second time to go and this one was just as exciting as the first. Two memorable things took place: First our delegation was seated 8 feet from the main speaker's podium so we were looking Supreme Knight Carl Anderson in the eyes and he was doing the same to us. The second was Mississippi being one of the delegations to second the motion to add Pro-Life as the 6th Surge Program.

A lighter moment was noticing a Bishop two rows back wearing a cowboy hat during the meeting. I ran into him at lunch and asked about how he got away with it. He looked up, smiled and said.. "Son. I'm from Texas... We all wear them"....then added.... "Of course I'm a Bishop too".

We wear name tags that say who we are. How we live our faith says what we are.

All but 1 council had attendance at the Mid Winter Meeting (7974)

All but 13 councils filed Mid Year Reports (1583, 1605, 2945, 2969, 7087, 8054, 8848, 8912, 9234, 9958, 10449 13502, 13936)

All but 19 councils filed End of Year Reports (1244, 1583, 1605, 2945, 2969, 6592, 7120, 7211, 7854, 8054, 8848, 8912, 9234, 9958, 11654, 11995, 12166, 13502, 13936)

State Membership Director's Report

After last year's convention, State Deputy elect Peter Sukanek asked if I would consider stepping down as State Program Director and assume the role of State Membership Director. I readily accepted his request and together we began to put together an action plan for the 2008-2009 fraternal year. The bar had been set extremely high with our predecessors achieving "Circle of Honor". So, we knew going in that goals would be stiff; at best. With this in mind, the Worthy State Deputy appointed Immediate Past State Deputy, Danny Lechner, to assist me as Round Table Coordinator and State Retention Chairman. My predecessor. Bill Waggoner, turned over all his electronic and hard copy records to me and we were off and running.

MEMBERSHIP

There were a couple of reports that the councils were used to seeing, so we felt no need to deviate from what had been handed down. However, with population shifts and varied council growth success, we found it necessary to adjust the membership limits for the different "Council Size Categories". Small Councils went to 62 members and below. Medium Councils went to 63-85 members. Large Councils were determined to be 86-160 members and Extra Large 161 and above. These divisions were based on the Supreme headcount as of 07/01/2009 and were subject to change each fraternal year. This move created much more balance within the size categories. It created 15 Small Councils, 15 Medium Councils, 14 Large Councils and 15 Extra Large Council. Supreme quotas were set relatively high this fraternal year and to help offset. Supreme set up a contest called the Membership World Series. To complement this contest and build on the momentum of the idea of March Madness, we set up our own contest. The State Membership Tournament Bracket was established. We pitted, like size, councils together in a monthly head to head membership contest. Winners, in each size division, would receive the winner cup and a place of honor at the state convention.

Our state goal for the year, based on a seven percent net gain, with the caveat for extra large and very small councils, was 430 new Knights. Despite our best effort we fell rather short of our lofty goal. Gross membership was at 251 new members. Of the 59 councils in Mississippi, 16 reached or exceeded their goal. Nine reached goal and 7 achieved top gun. Those 16 councils are listed below:

CONVENTION BUSINESS

Remarks of Supreme Council Representative Daniel J. Baker

Your Excellency, Worthy state officers, reverend fathers, delegates, spouses and family members, and my brother Knights: it is an honor and a great pleasure to share in your annual convention this weekend. Donna and I have always enjoyed that the Order has afforded us the opportunity to travel and make new friends. That is surely the case this weekend, and we appreciate the hospitality you have shown us. However, I think you ladies went well above and beyond the call of duty in taking Donna to every antiques store in Natchez. Hospitality should only go so far! Who has the truck going to Atlanta?

Convention time in the Knights of Columbus is an opportunity for local council leaders and their families to come together in community, compare notes, find out what other councils are doing, share successes and, most of all, honor those who have excelled, and of course to socialize. There's nothing like getting together face-to-face, even in this age of social networking!

This is a great opportunity for our wives to get to know one another, and for all of us to gather together as part of our Knights of Columbus family. After all we are a Family Fraternal Organization, and I've always thought of that family as a partnership. First, of course are our Brother Knights. The second member of the partnership is the clergy. Our Order was started by a parish priest, and we could not function without the participation and support of our priests and bishops. For that I thank all our clergy for what you do for our Church and our Order. The remaining partner is probably the most important—our wives and families. That we could not begin to accomplish our many goals without the involvement and support of our families goes without question. Sometimes you may be planting a tree or serving a meal with us, or maybe running a raffle or, on occasion, you might even say "go do something with the Knights and get out of my hair!" Whatever it is, we couldn't do it without you, and I thank all you ladies for everything you have been and will be to the Knights of Columbus!

Let's spend a few minutes this evening elaborating on some points that Supreme Knight Anderson mentioned in his video greetings to this convention. He pointed out that while we Knights donate more than \$150 million to charity each year, and that is no small accomplishment, what sets us apart is that we also "roll up our sleeves and give of ourselves"

Bill Gates, the founder of Microsoft, is said to be worth at least \$55 billion dollars. Even though his net worth was once over \$100 billion, he still has enough left to be able to write a check for millions of dollars to charity. But neither Bill Gates, nor William Buffet, nor anyone else, no matter how rich they are, could provide the 68 million hours of volunteer time that we Knights donated to charitable work last year. That is charity that comes straight from the heart, the kind of charity we are known for.

In his video message to this convention, the Supreme Knight offered some examples of volunteer work by Knights over the past year: Knights helping a wounded police officer, Knights providing a special van for amputee veterans of military service, Knights giving a big boost to a cancer research project, Knights establishing a school for their children,

Knights helping their neighbors recover from a devastating typhoon and Knights putting after-school programs for at-risk youngsters.

Of course, the response of Mississippi Knights to the devastation of Katrina is legend in the Order. Not only have you responded and recovered from that act of Nature, but yo continue to grow and do your charitable works for others. I understand that last year you raised over \$90,000 for seminarian education, and over \$70,000 for Persons with Intellectual Disabilities. I have to tell you, I am impressed and want to learn how you do it. I've always had what I call charity fundraising envy. I am always looking for more and for better ways to raise money to support our charities. I'm not leaving town until I get your secrets...

There are literally thousands of stories charity, and they happen <u>every</u> year in nearly <u>every</u> jurisdiction. We undertake these acts of charity because we see those in need through the eyes of faith.

As Pope Benedict wrote in his first encyclical, "Only if I serve my neighbor can my eyes be opened to what God does for me and how much he loves me."

Moreover, in the Knights of Columbus, we approach these acts of charity together—our second principle--unity. Benedict calls this the "practice of love... as a community."

Our charitable work is important for many reasons:

First, it fulfills Father McGivney's vision of a Catholic society dedicated to serving those in need. There's a very good reason why charity is the <u>first</u> principle of the Order. The Venerable Michael McGivney knew that if we put charitable work at the top of our priority list, if charity is our focus and vision, then everything else we do will support that vision

In the Gospel of Mark, Jesus elevates love of neighbor to a significance that is second only to loving God. "There is no other commandment greater than these," Jesus says. Father McGivney wanted to remind each of us that being a faithful Catholic Christian must always involve giving a very high priority to loving our neighbor, and all that that implies.

Charity is important to us as Knights because that is who we are, and what we do, and it communicates our essence to people outside the church who may not know much about us. It must always be a central part of our identity.

Another very huge effect of our charitable activity is a powerful inducement to men and families to join us. We all know that an active council is a healthy and growing council. Men don't join the Knights of Columbus because we contribute lots of money to worthy causes. They join because they see local councils doing what local councils do best—the good, charitable works of the Order. This is especially true as we seek to attract new members.

Knights of Columbus are known for many things, our **support** of **the Catholic Church**, and our Fourth Degree is a very visible presence at both church and civic events. Just the other day I was listening to the Catholic Channel on XM Radio, and they were discussing an informal survey about the best things about the Catholic Church.
