Prolife Committee Report 2015

The delegates comprising the 2015 Convention Prolife Committee reviewed and voted on all the submissions for the Best Prolife projects for the Diocese of Jackson and the Diocese of Biloxi. The chairman initially received 13 submissions from the State Program Director and some of these were submitted to the Prolife Committee to vote on. The Prolife Committee also reviewed and voted on the Family of the Year and Knight of Year submissions. We also discussed the following prolife projects:

- 1. Council 9543 (Madison) displayed 154 white crosses on the church grounds during Respect Life along with a sign stating that the crosses represent the number of abortions each hour in the United States. The council also led a prolife rosary after the October parish meal which was attended by 40 Knights and parishioners. The Girl Scout troop at church did a baby bottle drive with the proceeds going to Birthright of Jackson. The council had purchased 200 baby bottles for them to use. The council donated to the state Prolife Fund.
- 2. Council 7087 (Kiln) reported that they have 10 active prolife members and are trying to form a prolife committee. The council displays 350 crosses each year right in front of Annunciation church.
- 3. Council 13502 (Batesville) distributed prolife literature, to Protestant churches in Clarksdale. Council worked to get a part of Oakhurst cemetery in Clarksdale which is delineated by 4 praying angels set aside for babies who die. The Baptist Assn. supplies the coffins for these burials. Knight Raymond Cole visited Baptist churches to get donations for a mobile Ultrasound machine.
- 4. Council 11654 (Wiggins) performs several prolife projects like other councils. The council believes it is important to get the youth involved in prolife activities and to take the prolife message to them through social media. Councils need to let the youth tell them how we can help them.
- 5. Council 2180 (Laurel) leads the rosary during October and May in honor of Mary. The council leads a rosary at all masses on the anniversary of Roe vs. Wade. The council holds an annual pot luck supper to benefit a local domestic abuse center. The council participates with 50-70 church members annually in a Life Chain event. For the last two years the council has supported youth to attend the March for Life in Washington, DC. The council always has a prolife message in their council newsletter and the church bulletin.
- 6. Council 9124 (Gautier) is working to involve the youth in prolife programs. The council is involved in feeding the poor in their community. The council did a baby bottle drive and displayed 75 crosses. The council sponsored a rosary rally on Hwy 90 which 100 people attended and they participated in a Life Chain event.
- 7. Council 8054 (McComb) did a Life Chain event in October in front of church which 300 parishioners attended. They have a breakfast for the youth and lead a rosary for the

unborn. They mounted a headstone to the unborn in front of church. The council is involved in the annual baby bottle drive.

8. Raul Gamez (District Deputy #10) stated that his 6 councils are doing Life Chain events, Baby Bottle Drives, and they donate money to prolife causes. Three councils are doing cross displays and two councils purchased and erected monuments for the unborn on church grounds which are blessed each.

Many Councils reported activities in other Program Activity Report Areas, such as activities to raise money for the Seminarian Education Fund as a Church Activity but, they did not submit it as a Vocation Project Activity.
- 2. All the Committee Members suggested that future reports be written in Generic Terms without identifying information. Names, places and etc. should be on a separate cover sheet, so they would not need to be deleted, to prevent it from being identifiable to the Judging Committee. Deletions in a report makes it difficult to read and could impact current and future Judge's Decisions. It is suggested that the Face Sheet be removed prior to distribution to the judging committee members.

The Committee discussed several activities, other than to raise funds for Vocations, that could be promoted by the Council for participation within the Council and within the Parish. Some examples currently being conducted within the Parish are as follows:

2015 Mississippi Memorial Prolife Fund Report

Fund Establishment and Function

Delegates assembled at the 96th Annual Convention of the Mississippi State Council in Robinsonville, MS in April 2000 voted to establish a Mississippi Memorial Prolife Fund. This fund does not require any funds from the Mississippi State Council. This fund functions the same way the Bishop R. O. Gerow Memorial Fund for Priest Education does. Councils can contribute money to the fund throughout the year for presentation to the Bishop of Jackson and the Bishop of Biloxi at our annual state convention. Our bishops will distribute the funds to prolife organizations selected by their respective Diocesan offices.

How to Donate

Councils should always make their checks payable to the Mississippi State Council, Knights of Columbus. These donations should be sent to the State Treasurer or given to him or Memorial Prolife Fund Chairman for recording purposes. All donations will be deposited in the Mississippi State Council checking account and the State Treasurer will write checks to the Diocese of Biloxi and the Diocese of Jackson. Each year all donations will be listed and acknowledged in the Memorial Prolife Fund Chairman's report in our annual convention minute book and the council and assembly making the largest donation will be awarded a certificate at the Convention Banquet. There are plenty of councils that have not donated to this fund yet, so there is much room for improvement and increased donations to this worthy cause. The number of councils donating to the fund increased to 23 up from 14 in 2014.

2015 Statistics

23 Councils, 6 Assemblies and 4 Ladies Auxiliaries donated to the fund in 2015.

Total statewide donations decreased to \$8,231.93 from \$8,622.36 in 2014.

Total donations to the Diocese of Biloxi were \$2,785.50 down from \$3,007.60 in 2014.

Total donations to the Diocese of Jackson were \$ 5,446.43 down from 5,614.76 in 2014.

Total donations were down in 2015 due to a resolution passed at the 2013 convention to disperse the car tag collections beginning in July 2013 to the Bishop Rodi Disaster Relief Fund and the Ultrasound Fund and also because a collection at Knights and Ladies business meetings were not done.

Star Council Annual Report 2014-2015

Prepared by Bill Heath Star Council Director

This report is a summary of our work during this state year toward facilitating the growth of Star councils in the state of Mississippi.

As of this date, April 18, 2015, there are 5 councils who have met the requirements for Star. Five (5) councils lack 1 or 2 insurance policies or annuities to qualify and 19 other councils throughout the state have a realistic chance of achieving Star council before the end Supreme's fraternal year on June 30, 2015. Originally our goal in Mississippi was to have 42 councils, achieve Star status.

In my opinion, one of the main reasons we did not make our goal during the state fraternal year was two-fold. First, we did not have enough active councils. In the state we have 63 active councils, that being said however, there are 30 councils who have a net gain of zero (0%). Translation, 30 councils recruited no one or did not take advantage of purchasing our insurance or annuity products to help the families of our membership. Secondly, the creation of a new position within the state, known as Star Council Director and my lack of experience as to how best to help the DDs and GKs throughout the state may have played a role also in our inability to reach our STAR council goal.

That being said, ultimately the responsibility falls to the council and its leadership to provide the programs that encourages members to be more involved and to invite others to be part of the KCs. The state leadership can and should play a part in facilitating the growth of councils through providing training, recognition, and activities that will promote achievement of council, state, and supreme goals.

As the Grand Knight, my mission remains building on the excellent work of Past Grand Knight, Ron DiPalma, and to continue to improve on that foundation. Specifically, I wanted to generate greater visibility of the knights in the faith-based community in Philadelphia and surrounding areas. Neshoba County, in which Philadelphia is the county seat, is primarily Protestant, with very few Catholics. Holy Cross Catholic Church is comprised of approximately 75 families. However, our council also represents four other parishes; Holy Rosary in Tucker, St. Catherine in Conehatta, St. Therise in Choctaw and, most recently, Sacred Heart in Louisville. Two of our newest knights are from Louisville. Most people in our area do not know a Catholic, and if they do, they don't know it.

There are two ways to become more recognized in the community:

-Contribute money to local charities and public causes, and

-Contribute labor, sweat equity, to these same community activities.

Council #13471 is a small council. We have roughly fifty members, with maybe ten knights continually active. We raise funds from annual dues (\$30.00) and two raffles per year. There is a gun raffle in the Fall and a 50/50 raffle, combined with a St. Patrick's celebration event, in the Spring. Accordingly, we are very limited on individual monetary contributions; usually \$100.00 to \$200.00. Donations at that level are, of course, appreciated, but not noteworthy in the community. Accordingly, we focus on smaller monetary donations with collections of food and other household items and a substantial contribution of our time in services.

Over the last two years, a community effort of several faith-based organizations, has developed in Philadelphia, called "Open Arms", to provide a hot meal to the disadvantaged at least one Saturday per month. The meal was normally served at a local community center on the fourth Saturday of each

month. Recently, Open Arms acquired a building from a donor and are considering expanding the number of times a month they will serve the hungry. The knights have become very visible through our donation of services to this effort.

Also, our Council provides food items from our church's food bank along with three to six volunteer knights for every event to set up, assist in the kitchen, help serve the meals and handle break down. We wear our Council polo shirts identifying us as knights. Everyone now knows there are Catholics here and who the Knights of Columbus are. We plan to continue this activity.

A summary of our Council activities for the year follows:

- MEMBERSHIP: The Council began the year (April 1, 2014) with 70 members 53 Associate and 17 Insurance. As of March 31, 2015, we have 83 members –63 Associate and 18 Insurance. We have 2 candidates which have been accepted for membership and will be making their 1st Degree soon. The Council conducted 2 1st Degree ceremonies this year.
- PROGRAMS: At the April 2014 Convention the Council contributed \$2500 to the Seminarian Bishop Gerow Fund

Also in April the Council sponsored tables at the Right to Life Banquet and made a donation to the Area 8 Special Olympics Mudbug Mambo.

Council was awarded the Triple Star

In May the Council recognized our Parish scouts by purchasing the religious medals earned by the boys.

Also in May the Council sponsored the second annual Father's Day Walk for Life. Walkers gathered at St. Richard and walked to the abortion "clinic", prayed and returned to St. Richard for a brunch.

Also in May the council sent the DGK and Membership Chairman to the State Membership Workshop held at St. Paul's, Flowood In June we held a First Degree Exemplification. . At the end of the month the Council again sponsored the annual Parish Picnic.

In July the Council hosted a dinner and reception for Biking for Babies, a group of young people riding bicycles from New Orleans to Chicago to raise funds and awareness for the Culture of Life.

Also in July the Council sent representatives to the School of Columbianism.

A service project in July was to prep, pressure wash and seal, the deck at Sr. Carroll's residence.

In August the Council held its first installation of Officers as part of the Sunday Mass. Afterward the officers, Chaplin, spouses and friends met for breakfast. This was also a corporate communion gathering.

Also in August the Council made contributions to Habitat for Humanity, and Why Not Now Mississippi. Why Not Now Mississippi is an organization which provides meals and various sundries to both the homeless and other less fortunate at Smith Park.

In August Council sent representatives to the Parish Child Protection course

In September the Council conducted the Silver Rose ceremony. The ceremony began at the vigil Mass by having the rose processed in, staged on the Altar, and processed out to Foley Hall where Fr. Mike and Council team conducted the balance of the ceremony.

Also in September the Council initiated "red shirt" Sunday. Simply stated Knights are encouraged to wear their red Knight shirt to whatever Mass they attend. Purpose is to bring visibility of the K of C to the parish.

In September the Council held initial presentation on "2nd Responders" project. This resulted in 3 volunteers to the project.

In October the Council sponsored a team in the annual Special Kid's Golf Tournament. This team was proposed by our Chaplin Padre Juan. The people wanted to participate, but could not afford the fee.

Also in October the Council sent a representative to the Catholic Charities "Journey of Hope" luncheon and made a financial contribution.

In October we assigned the Council's "keep Christmas" program Chairman.

The Council sent a congratulatory check to Jason Johnson, our RSVP seminarian, upon his "Rite of Admission to Candidacy for Ordination

In November we hosted the Monsignor Glynn Vocations Brunch to honor our priests, religious and seminarians and raise funds and prayers for vocations. Bishop Kopacz celebrated Mass and as a result of his participation the Council set record attendance and donations. We also supported Squat and Gobble, a community fund raiser to provide services to the victims of domestic violence.

In December we conducted a Keep Christ in Christmas magnate and yard sign campaign and held our annual Council Christmas Party. Also in December the Council made a donation to the Little Sisters of the Poor.

In January the Council hosted a dinner for a busload of kids from across the dioceses that were embarking on their journey to Washington for the March for Life. The event was also celebrated by Bishop Kopacz.

Also in January The Council supplied a fine dining meal for a luncheon celebrating the history of the Sisters in the State of MS. This was a combined effort with St Francis of Madison MS. In addition the Council subsidized 20 DVD's for the Sister's vocations project. They distributed them to High Schools and Colleges around the State.

In January conducted a 1st. Degree Exemplification.

Completed and submitted all forms required in January.

Councils in my district excelled in many areas this year. Four of the Five Councils in District 9 now have active First Degree Teams. Recently 1522 and 11995 conducted their 1st, First degree ceremony. State Deputy Report Jim McCraw

Your Excellencies, Reverend Fathers, Worthy Supreme Director Harger, Worthy State Officers, Worthy Past State Deputies, Delegates to the 111th Annual State Meeting of the Mississippi Knights of Columbus..., my brother knights all:

It is my honor to present my report to you on the state of the Order in Mississippi.

I would like to begin by thanking each of you for the privilege of serving as your state deputy. Along with many responsibilities, it is the best place to effect change in a jurisdiction. Your continued support and words of encouragement, and especially your form 100s that are not suspensions, have been greatly appreciated.

This past year has moved much more quickly that I could have anticipated. In fact my year began much more quickly than I had anticipated.

Preparation and Staffing

There is a great deal of planning, recruiting, and decision-making that has to be done before heading to New Haven to meet with all the other new state deputies and the Supreme staff in early June. It was important to interview current as well as potential state chairmen, directors and DDs to determine if we shared the same vision, and if so would they serve in 2014-2015. A total of 21 meetings took place at restaurants, church offices, hotel lobbies and kitchen tables throughout the state.

I was fortunate to have Joe Jones, Carl Brochard, Joe Goellner and Bob Leo agree to keep their positions for one more year. Not all were eager but understood the overall goal and the importance of maintaining stability in their areas. The next group was the district deputies. I spoke to each of them on their importance, my expectations and we discussed any concerns on both sides. Chuck Heim, Danny Setaro and Denny Fink were appointed to fill vacancies. All were highly recommended and I believed we would make a good team. I set one rule with the DDs. They could not serve as grand knight and district deputy. Stradford Goins said it was a great rule as he had done both the previous year and it was a mistake. Under this policy, OD Landrum would not be reappointed. With no one else able to serve, this left District 8 unassigned, making it my responsibility. Because of the amount of travel that would be required, Tylertown was transferred to Luis Ybarra and District 7. This made sense as most of their 4th degree guys were in the same Assembly as McComb. I did not anticipate the council's reaction and belief they were no longer part of the Biloxi Diocese. The council was asked to sit tight until midyear. This later turned out to be a bigger problem that I had anticipated. The council held a vote to disband and most of the leaders transferred to council 15382 in January. Much of this had to do with the DD selection.

State Program director Guy Heying and I met several times to find ways to make our program areas more integrated with the councils. We also felt it made sense for the state directors to meet separate from the State Organizational meeting. With a number of new guys coming in, they needed time to develop their plan.

Paul Mitchell was highly recommended for Membership Director, having served as Grand Knight of Woolmarket Council and one of the finest COs in the Order. Mike Kassouf was appointed at State Retention Chairman and would assist Paul as needed. In January, Paul agreed to move over to Ceremonials to assist Jerry Schmuck and help develop a Second Degree team along the coast that could travel. Mike Kassouf was appointed to replace Paul and build on the work he had put in place.

After attending the Supreme Convention in Orlando with David Scott, I met a Star Council Director from Texas. After talking with him, it seemed like the perfect thing to try in Mississippi. Bill Heath agreed to take the position and worked with his counterparts in Texas to get things rolling. The goal: Increase the number of Star Councils.

Strategic Plan

In addition to meeting with both current and potential leaders, the state officers worked with me, Jose Jimenez and our new State Chaplain, Msgr Elvin Sunds to identify the most pressing issues and prioritize them.

The tool to document all this was the state's 3-year Strategic Plan on membership, insurance, program activities, potential leaders, diocesan parish stats, strengths and weaknesses. We gathered strategic plans for the past 7 years from our past state deputies. We also sent the Strategic Plan form to 30 council leaders, our district deputies and state chairmen to provide diverse opinions and recommendations. We also involved each diocese to help us identify parishes and mission parishes. Our research included predictive trends analysis with population, aging and economic development. We found valuable data that helped identify growth opportunities and where to anticipate a need for services.

The strategic plan identified 15 weaknesses and issues to be addressed. I will read them and give you the status or action taken.

1. Over 1/3 of the members in Mississippi were still 1st Degree members.

Each council has been tasked to review each member and insert any missing degree date or the word "Yes". The most common factor in a member not advancing was 2nd and 3rd degrees were held together on the same day, usually a Saturday or Sunday, for most of a day. If the candidate couldn't make that date, it would be at least 6 months before another opportunity came up. It doesn't take long before the man loses interest in advancing

- 2. Nobody was tracking degrees to insure they were reported and the form 100s submitted in a timely manner. State Membership and Retention Director Mike Kassouf now reviews each 1st degree Form 450 and monitors the form 100s that are associated with it.
- 3. Few were submitting updates when a member advanced to the next degree.
 - This remains a FS responsibility, however, DDs continue to provide a list of candidates from each degree to participating councils.
- 4. Copies of State and Supreme reports are not sent to DD and State Deputy.
 - Copies sent to sdreport are monitored against list of "missing reports" at Supreme. If we have one Supreme is missing, it is sent to them.
- 5. The Councils need more 2nd and 3rd degrees in every district.
 - We now have 4 Conferring Officers and can do 3rd degrees anywhere.
 - We now have 7 2nd degree teams and have significantly increased the number of degrees held, as well as diverse locations.
 - Also established 7pm for start time during the week.
- 6. Council officers want more training on their duties and responsibilities.
 - State Training Director, Mike Kassouf has conducted over 8 FS & Leadership training courses throughout the state.
- 7. Many councils do not assign program chairmen to organize projects.
 - This is a council decision but it is a major point in leadership training.
- 8. State directors should communicate with their council counterpart instead of the grand knight. In January, Guy Heying was provided a list of all council chairmen and their email addresses... if it was included on the 365 report. This was shared with his state directors.
- 9. The bond for many financial secretaries and treasurers was at risk of forfeiture because the trustees did not conduct the semi-annual audits.
 - Council responsibility to insure they comply.
- 10. Council FS need assistance locating members with bad addresses or moved with no forwarding address. Currently, these members will be suspended despite a desire to keep them.

 State Council contracted with an internet search company for a tool to do this. State Retention Chairman Mike Kassouf will research info provided by the council FS. This has proven to be useful.

11. Some councils are perceived as inactive we needed to know if they were "at risk".

 State Officers have begun to visit more of these councils and find they are very involved within the parish and well regarded by the pastor. They either lack someone to promote what they do or prefer to keep a low profile. We continue to preach "Tell your Story" and take photos wherever we go and submit to the Magnolia Knight. It tells the council they are important.

12. The Magnolia Knight needs more content from local councils and a wider circulation to members.

- This effort began two years ago and is now bearing fruit. Under Editor Jack Jennings efforts, the MK has grown 6 pages last year to 18 this year. Copies now go to many supreme personnel and state deputies. It also goes to priests in the Jackson Diocese and Mississippi Catholic & Gulf Pine Catholic. Still need more member email addresses.
- **13. Not all councils are in compliance with IRS to maintain their tax exempt status.** State Advocate continues to get requests from councils trying to find their EIN. He added this info to the state directory.

14. Council trustees need to keep up with 990 filing and their EIN.

- Councils are now required to record their EIN & latest filed date of their 990 on the Semi-Annual Audit form 1295. This catches a missed filing.
- **15. Many parishes, particularly mission parishes, do not have a KC presence or a round table may be established but not reported.** 11 round tables have been reported this year. We estimate there should be as many as 45. As parishes merge or close, this will change.

These 15 items seem extreme but, in fact, they are things we tackle each year. The difference is, this time they are being reported to you, in hopes you will continue to provide assistance and direction in addressing them.

Our State and Regional meetings are being spread around to stimulate more excitement among the local members as well as those in the area. We are maintaining an inventory of these sites for Leadership & FS Training as well as special meetings.

As we moved forward with our plan, we adopted a two year theme: "Developing Catholic Leaders, Strengthening Catholic Families". This year the focus has been on Developing Catholic Leaders. Training sessions are held statewide and involve MPC Dave Tebo. This is something we will need to continue for several years. The ideal plan will be for DDs to conduct portions of it at District meetings.

We are making progress in several areas but as of this convention, our biggest issue and major focus is Retention.

Our motto "*Retention Begins When the Form 100 is signed*" says it all. The prep work of making sure he understands who we are and we know more about him, insures he is joining for the right reason. I hope the days of wearing a fellow down until he joins are not so common. The man coming in with his eyes wide open is a solid member.

It is essential that once a man signs the form, the council should act promptly to get council approval and get him to a First Degree. How he is introduced and welcomed also is a factor in his sense of belonging. Handshakes at every opportunity is a positive.

Among the 15 issues I listed the most significant involves Retention. Mississippi does a good job each year welcoming brother knights into the Order but as one comes in, two go out the back door.

A good example of this is this current fraternal year. We began the year with 6,710 members and have already recruited 249. The bad news is we currently have 6,730. We lost 150 to suspensions and withdrawals. The rest were deaths or transfers to councils outside the state.

We acknowledge putting more focus on continued contact with all members will take time to become a habit. It is a major step that requires little effort and guaranteed to stabilize our retention.

Other exciting news is a projected 17 Star Councils, perhaps more, this year. Special attention has also been given to our Ladies Auxiliaries. They have been a stabilizing force in many areas of the State. Today, they too, struggle with retention.

Deputy Supreme Knight Logan Ludwig told us in New Haven "I didn't join the Knights to go to meetings. I joined to make a difference". This means more program participation and we will see how that has paid off during our awards ceremonies tonight.

My brothers, I thank you again for what each of you do and for your friendship!

State Secretary Report

Your Excellencies, Worthy Supreme Rep, Worthy Past State Deputies, Fellow State Officers and My Brother Knights,

This has been a very productive year as I've served as your state secretary. I was pleased to have been sent to Dallas by Supreme for a training workshop in July. It was to prepare the state secretary, membership and program directors from each jurisdiction for their upcoming duties. It was very informative and provided the attendees with the opportunity to get to know our Supreme officers, Membership & Program Consultants and our counterparts from other states. Mississippi was in a group that included Arkansas, Delaware, Rhode Island and a few other states. We all had similar challenges and enjoyed very candid discussions on how to address them. Supreme Master of the Fourth Degree Dennis Stoddard was our facilitator.

In August I represented Mississippi as one of your delegates to the Supreme Convention in Orlando. It was a great experience with the exception of the arrival flight. Patty and I was delayed in Charlotte and end up having to go through Miami to finally arrive in Orlando late that night. These conventions are part of the Experience of a Lifetime we talk about. Like our own state convention, delegates and alternates are elected but any 3'd degree member may attend the business meetings and the States Dinner is open to all. I would encourage any brother knight to try and attend at least of these events. On these trips, it is the State Secretaries responsibility to choose and make reservations for the delegations Wednesday night meal. This year I chose a Polynesian restaurant and it turned out to be a success. It is a great experience and I thank the delegates for giving Patty and I the opportunity be involved.

In January we held the mid-winter meetings. We established the session booklets that contained most of the presentations put together for the attendees. They seemed to be well received and the State Officers will probably fund this effort for future meetings. Online registration for the meetings was also introduced. This gave the host councils a better idea of how many Knights would be attending and how much food to prepare.

When I reflect on what I consider significant achievements for the administrative side of the state council, expanding how we use our state website is at the very

top of my list. For a few years we have slowly replaced submitting paper reports with online submissions. This year we continued moving this effort forward.

Convention delegates and alternates were reported through the website. Rather than mail the same documents to the state deputy and state secretary, you were able to enter it one time and print your delegate credentials.

The FS still has to sign and seal or notarize the credentials but there is no question if they were received by the State.

We are able to use this data base to compare with convention registrations. This insures your folks don't have a problem when they show up. There were a few kinks but overall, the results were excellent.

Necrology reporting is also done through the website now. The advantage with this is legibility of the names and a longer window to turn in unexpected deaths. This year we collected 89 names and the necrology file was displayed so you could if your people have all been submitted.

The Per Capita statements were sent out by email in July. I developed a new automate invoice that incorporates the roster file and FS email listing from Supreme. This process gives more control to the state secretary over who has been billed and when. As long as the FS uses member management and keeps his council's data current, the billing will be as accurate as it can be.

The key component is keeping the member management data updated. I thank Mike Kassouf for bringing this message to the Financial Secretaries, through his training sessions.

The January billing had email addresses for 98.8% of the intended recipients. In a case where the FS does not have one listed, that person did not receive a copy and a hard copy was mailed to the GK and FS.

There were only couple of instances where the email did not get to the intended address. In those cases, it was because of new Financial Secretaries being appointed. I contribute this to the hard work being done by FS's throughout the state. Thank you for your hard work.

The last item is, also, technology related. Biloxi did a great job this year accepting convention registrations and payments online. I don't recall what percentage they received, but approximately 90% registered online.

There were some hiccups this year but not as many as in the past. We, as a team, are getting more experienced in this process. I apologize for any inconvenience you may have experienced and appreciate you reporting them to us so quickly.

With these additional enhancements made, the Convention Registration System now provides numerous online reporting of delegates, convention registrations and several other tracking items that are vital to convention committees. It is my opinion, that the state council should provide and maintain this service each year, with the host councils providing the specific details on their event. Making this an almost fill in the blank process, means registration and promotion can go online quickly.

As I close my year, I want to share with you the precept we as state officers try to follow "Leave your office better than you found it". It works well for you at the council and district level and it has worked well for us. I have tried, through the chairs, to automate the processes just a little and give the brother knight that follows a little easier job.

My brothers, again, I thank you for the opportunity to be of service to you and I look forward to serving you next year.

The State purchased Quick Books Pro in 2011 while Jim was State Treasurer. Noel loaded the records on the program while he was Treasurer and closed out the 2014 year on Quick Books Pro. I keep our financial records with this software and I generated a P&L report for April 1 2014 through March 31, 2015. A copy is attached to this report.

State Advocate's Report -2014-2015

State Officers, Worthy Past State Deputies and my dear brother Knights:

June 2014

I was honored to attend Supreme training in Dallas that covered several issues critical to the Order: Protection of Youth and protection. Supreme implemented significant new procedures to train key Council officers about child sexual abuse. Supreme implemented training requirements for Grand Knights and Youth-facing council positions using a recognized training program: NNNN. Supreme training also covered new guidance regarding Home Corporations. Supreme has done significant research in optimal legal structures for relations between Knights of Columbus Councils. Excellent materials are available for Council and Home Corporation officers to establish a relationship that clearly separates Knights of Columbus as a legal entity from Home Corporations. The purpose of this is to insulate the Knights of Columbus and Councils from liability that may be incurred by a Home Corporation in renting its facility to the public.

• Provided guidance to District Deputy helping a Council research its status on filing IRS Form 990s.

July 2014

• At the State Schools of Columbianism I provided Council officers with current information on these issues and assisted officers in understanding and implementing Supreme guidance on these issues, when requested.

August 2014

• Assisted State Deputy and Diocese of Jackson Youth Director regarding Knights of Columbus member use of social media.

September 2014

- Question from Council on qualification for membership
- Assisted State Deputy regarding Council reactivation
- Answered question from Diocesan Protection of Children about what protection of youth training that Knights who work with youth are required to attend.

October 2014

• Attended Council installation of officers in Leland with State Deputy

November 2014

• Answered question about KC state liability and coverage of specified Council activity

December 2014

Represented State Officers at Council holiday event recognizing community members

January 2015

• Assisted Council with EIN information

April 2015

• After consulting with State Deputy, submitted Resolutions passed at the 2015 State Convention to the Supreme Secretary for consideration at Supreme Convention

March 2015

• Answered question on proper way to allow donor to claim tax exemption for donation to Bishop Gerow Fund.
