E-Membership Report Charles (Chuck) Heim 2022 – 2023 Year End Report

As the States Membership South and E-Membership Director I respectfully submit the following Report.

The E-membership is a relatively new initiative for the Knights of Columbus. Interest has been limited in previous years. However, this fraternal year there was seen a continued interest in the e-membership initiative. The number of e-members processed from 1 April 2020 through 31 March 2021 was approximately 50 new members. During the same period from 1 April 2021 through 31 March 2022 there were 123 new members who expressed an interest in joining the order through the E-membership initiative. During the same period 31 March 2022 through 1 April 2023 there was only 91 new members interested in joining the order through E-Membership initiative. A push was made to increase the membership in an attempt to reach the state goals for the outgoing State Deputy. From April - July 2023 an additional 45 new members joined through the e-membership initiative. Supreme continued to extend the incentive, to join the order for free through 31 December 2022 which was another favorable incentive that help increase the interest for new members to join the order through on-line e-membership program. This incentive was helpful but there was actually a decrease in e-membership during the period from 31 March 2022 through 1 April 2023. This incentive was initially advertised as being available only through the end of Calendar year 2022. As the year progressed the incentive was extended through the end of the Fraternal Year 2023 which may account for the increase in membership during April – July 2023.

The e-membership program continued to struggle with converting members from the e-membership into local councils. At the end of March 2022, the number of e-members waiting to be transferred into their assigned council remained at approximately 50 members, with 10 of the remaining from the previous year's carry over. At the end of July 2023 there were 80 members that had not been converted of which 37 were carried over from previous years. Two of the main issues identified by the councils include being unable to contact the e-members or not being able to schedule an agreeable time to conduct the ceremony necessary to complete the transfers into the council. There were also several e-members who indicated they joined with no intention to transfer into a local council and only wanted to see what the organization was all about. It has been noted previously that Supreme has no requirement for a member to complete their degree and transfer into a local council.

E-membership continues to be a recruiting tool available to help councils increase their membership.
