

- Thank you for the opportunity to address the convention. My name is Joe McInerney and I am the VP for leadership and ethics education for the Knights. I am also the Financial Secretary of the Commodore John Barry Council #14534. It is an absolute honor and blessing to be here with you for your convention.
- I became a Knight because of the JPII institute. That institute, like so many good things in this world, would not exist without the Knights. It's a funny thing. The knights do so many things, do so much good. When you join it's not just your own work for the needy that you are doing. You are joining a band of brothers that does so much good for the world. I know you've heard all of our accolades but we should not take them for granted. Our work does so much good.

• But I want to focus on briefly on two things today. This afternoon I want to talk about leadership and tonight I will talk about the Holy Spirit. These are not unrelated topics and you have our worthy State Deputy brother Guy to thank for suggesting the leadership guy talk about leadership.

Leadership of Council 14534

So, I'd like to tell you briefly about my experiences with the Commodore John Barry Council, Council number 14534, at the United States Naval Academy. I am the financial secretary of that council, and it sounds like we have had similar struggles to some of the Councils in Mississippi. And I want to tell you how my amazing leadership has turned that council around. Well, that's not exactly what happened, but here's the story.

Prior to Covid the Council was losing energy and Covid killed it. We were still alive on paper, we had 420 people on our council roles, and literally no one in the council.

So, we began to rebuild the council in 21-22. I volunteered to be financial secretary and I found a student, actually he found me, that I thought was the perfect Grand Knight. He was a recent convert, really bright, articulate, and on fire for the faith. And he wanted to be Grand Knight. Perfect. I could not have asked for a better person to lead the charge to get the council moving again. So, I thought. There was one problem. He wasn't dependable. Sometimes he would show up and respond to emails and sometime he would not. He was not dependable and the council never got on his feet all throughout that year. We had a few meetings, we would get jazzed, and then crickets for a couple of months. We failed to have any meetings after Spring break of that year and

finished the year pretty much where we started. And I was pretty discouraged. In the fall of 22 we started again. This time we had a core of about six friends, one of whom was my son, that was willing to go to an initial meeting. We said we need a leader, and one of them (not my son) volunteered to be Grand Knight. I wouldn't have picked him. He's a good kid, a big kid, a varsity baseball player. Not articulate and his faith seemed sincere but quite immature. We went with him and his leadership made all the difference. He was dependable, he was laid back and had a good sense of humor. What stood about him was he listened to what his friends wanted. And what did they want? Two things—one I couldn't give them and one that I could. The first and most important thing they wanted was a space where they could talk so they could figure out—together—how to be a Catholic man in secular America in the 21st century. That was something I couldn't give. I wanted to tell them how to do that. I wanted to give them all my amazing insights and give articulate speeches to inspire them to be great Catholics and Knights. That wasn't their interest. The Grand Knight told me they wanted to talk. They wanted to raise issues, even give presentations, about interesting, challenging aspects of the faith and then talk about how to apply it to their lives. They got a list of presentations together and they started talking and they haven't stopped. What did I do? I bought them pizza and tried as hard as I could to keep my mouth shut.

It's been working. We've been growing. We have more work to do to be an excellent council, but we are on the right track.

So, what are the lessons I draw from that experience? One, give them food they like. Yes. That's important. Two, show up. One thing I knew I had to do was be there. If I weren't reliable showing up they wouldn't be either. Three, listen to what they want to do together. If you offer a forum for what your audience wants they will come back. Three, their questions were real and they were hard. They wanted compelling answers. And no one can answer the questions of the human heart the way Jesus Christ and his body the Church can. We have a three-thousand-year tradition of wisdom to offer young and old men alike. And at the

center of that tradition is God Himself, Jesus Christ. It's a formula that has attracted men and women for two thousand years. Yes, the Church has always struggled, and it is struggling today, but it has never ceased to grow and as our Lord tells us, the gates of hell will not prevail against it. If we offer Christ to the men of our communities and our parishes, they will join us.

So how do we offer Christ? The short answer is Christ must be at the center of hearts for us to be able to share him. You can't share what you don't have.

This is an idea worth spending more time on, but I'd like to save those thoughts for my comments tonight.

Thank you for the opportunity to speak with you today. And thank you for everything you do for the Knights of Columbus.






Provincial Meeting

State Reports Chairman 2023-2024


During the 2023-24 fraternal year, the state councils submitted 257 standard reports to Supreme. Of these the state received copies of 92 of those reports. All but one of the active councils submitted the Form 185 – Report of Officers to Supreme, but only 9 sent copies to the state. Fifty-one councils submitted to the Form 365 – Service Personnel to Supreme again with only nine copying the state. Fifty-five councils submitted the Form 1728 – Fraternal Survey with thirteen coping the state. Five councils participated in the Family of the Month program, sending at least one submission to the state. Four councils submitted copies of the Faith in Action reports (form 10784) to the state. One district deputy submitted copies of his Council Health Assessments to the state.


