

Honorary/Honorary Life Membership—-A member who has attained the age of 65 years and who has been a member of the Order 25 consecutive years shall be designated an honorary member. The honorary member is exempt from general fund charges except, in Msgr. Leech Council 4472, a charge of \$1.

Members who have attained the age of 70 years and who have been members of the Order for 25 consecutive years and those who have been members of the Order for 50 consecutive years regardless of age, shall be designated as honorary life members. Honorary Life members are exempt from payment of dues, per capita charges and assessments. No Supreme or state council assessments are levied against them. All priest and religious brothers who have taken their final or perpetual vows are automatically designated as honorary life members upon receiving the First Degree of the Order.


