# A Word from Our State Deputy

Worthy State Officers, District Deputies, Grand Knights, and fellow Knights of the Mississippi Jurisdiction:

As we prepare for this year's annual State Convention, I would hope everyone is working diligently to meet the goals we have established at the beginning of the fraternal year. There is still much to be accomplished.

A few councils have qualified as TOP GUN Council by doubling their State Membership goal. Several councils have met their membership goal; others have recruited at least one new member. However, there are a handful of councils that have not recruited any new members. Let's shoot to have every council new membership active.

It should not be difficult to take a little time and work with your Program Chairman to complete the State's Program Awards package and send it in by the March 31st deadline. Reports will be accepted at the convention. Deadline for submission of these reports is May 15, 2006. Help the State Secretary Danny Lechner by providing both a paper and electronic copy of your report.

Each Grand Knight will soon be receiving their copy of this year's State Directory. A lot of time was spent putting it together

before Katrina only to have it destroyed. We had to start from scratch to gather the needed information. If councils or assemblies did not send in their Form 185, Report of Elected Officers, or the Directory Data Collection Sheet, their contact information is not contained in this edition.

Scheduled Degrees: Here are the dates for upcoming degrees: 2nd/3rd - Clarksdale, Feb 18th; 2nd/3rd - Starkville, Feb 25th; 4th Degree - Meridian, March 11th. Grand Knights should notify the respective District Deputies or Host Grand Knight to let them know how many candidates to expect.

## Financial Aid Plan Set for Jackson Diocese Deacons

There are three deacons from Mexico who will be ordained this June for service in the Catholic Diocese of Jackson. These deacons are Deacon Lenin Vargas, Deacon Mario Solorzano Cruz and Deacon Benjamin Martinez. Deacon Vargas will be ordained at St. Peter Cathedral in Jackson on June 3, 2006. Deacon Solorzano Cruz will be ordained in his home town in Mexico on June 13, 2006, and Deacon Martinez will be ordained in his home town in Mexico on June 14, 2006. Discussions were held between Fr. Kent Bowlds, Diocese of Jackson Vocation Director, and Larry Tabor, Mississippi State Deputy, and Deacon Larry Campbell, Vocation Director for the Diocese of Jackson for the Knights of Columbus. It was decided to ask the councils and assemblies in the Diocese of Jackson to set as a goal raising a total of \$6,000 to assist these men in meeting their initial priestly ministry expenses. These expenses are: purchasing and paying for an automobile, purchase of their own chalice, their vestments, and clerical clothing. Another expense might be for transportation to and from their homes prior to assuming their first assignment. We realize that this is a large sum of money; however, knowing the generosity of our Knights in the diocese and their support for our Bishop, Priests, Deacons, and Seminarians, it is felt that this goal is achievable. What is being asked is that each council and assembly promote this fundraising endeavor. It is the hope of Deacon Campbell that this \$6,000 sum can be raised by this year's convention. In this way all monies raised in this program will count toward totals raised by councils and assemblies for the Priest Education Fund.

Fr. Kent Bowlds, Br. Larry Tabor and Deacon Campbell feel that Fr. Kent should have administrative oversight of these funds. With this in mind, they are asking that all checks be made payable to the Catholic Diocese of Jackson and mailed to Fr. Kent Bowlds at St. Richard Catholic Church, 1242 Lynnwood Drive, Jackson, MS 39206. Once received, these checks will be deposited with the Catholic Diocese of Jackson and disbursed to these three deacons in an equitable manner. District Deputies are encouraged to communicate the specifics of this program to each of the councils in their district and please encourage 100% participation from each council. ## **Pro-Life Suggestions**

State Officers, State Program Chairman, District Deputies, Grand Knights, Faithful Navigators, Ladies Auxiliary Presidents

I believe that our Pro-life Activities in the past -- though worthwhile and admirable — have been too narrowly focused on one aspect of the pro-life movement, combating abortion. The pro-life movement encompasses many things---- prayer, abortion, the death penalty, assisted suicide, euthanasia, human rights, access to medical care, and poverty.

The issues seem complicated and sometime we feel we cannot do anything to support a Culture of Life and work against the Culture of Death. Here are some simple things we all can do to support a Culture of Life:

- 1. Pray for a growing Respect For Life. Pray to end Abortion and the Death Penalty.
- Start every Rosary you and your council says with those intentions.
- 2. Educate your council, assembly and ladies auxiliary members on the Catholic teachings and beliefs on these subjects by asking your pastor to talk at one of your meetings or in your adult education program.
- 3. Express to other that you are pro-life by wearing a precious feet lapel pin, or by putting a Pro-life Bumper Sticker on your vehicles.
- 4. Hold a fundraiser and donate the money to a local pro-life group or the Mississippi Memorial Pro-life Fund. Since 2001 only 32 councils (58%), 3 assemblies (12%) and 1 ladies auxiliary (5%) have donated to this statewide Knights of Columbus fund. Our goal should be 100% participation.
- Try to donate at least \$25.00 to this fund annually. (see attached report for a listing of donations. 5. Use pro-life checks. Copy the order sheet from Life Checks and provide to your members your meetings
- 6. Switch to a phone company that donates a portion of your bill to Pro-life organizations.
- Attached are sheets from Sienna Communications, Pro Life Communications and Vitae.

Make your church office aware that Verizon, Bell South, SBC, AT& T and Sprint match employee contributions to Planned Parenthood - the largest abortion provider in the US. These companies also sponsor gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender employee groups. In 2003 AT & T and MCI reported over 1 billion dollars in dial-a-porn revenue. Did you know that by doing business with these companies you are helping them support these causes. Viable, alternative phone service providers do exist.

- 7. Sponsor a child in a developing nation for \$30.00/month or make a donation. See the sheet from the Christian Foundation for Children and Aging whose program is grounded in Catholic Social Teaching.
- 8. Consider applying for a pro-life credit card that donates a portion of it's profits to Pro-life organizations. See the sheet from Vitae.
- 9. Invest your money in mutual funds that only buy stock in companies that support Catholic values and teachings. See the sheets on Ave Maria Mutual Funds and The Aguinas Funds.
- 10. Become a blood or platelet donor or organ donor. Hold a blood drive at your church.
- 11. Do volunteer work at a hospital or nursing home. Visit nursing home patients. Ask your local nursing home how you can hold an activity at their location.
- 12. Vote for Pro-life candidates. Support Pro-life and Pro-family legislation.
- 13. Order and sell or have your youth group sell "Life is Precious" rubber bracelets to show others that you are Pro-life. Donate the money to a Pro-life organization. See the order sheet from Heritage House 76. The cost is 89 cents each for 50 and 79 cents each for 100.
- 14. Go to the Supreme website and learn about the KC pro-life activities and check out the links provided there.

# Ceremonial Baldric Available

The Knights of Columbus Ceremonial Baldric is now available for optional use by a council First Degree Team. The baldric shall be worn with a dark suit and the jewel of office by the ceremonial presenter. It should appear over the right shoulder, extending to the left hip and the Knights of Columbus emblem should be centered upon the chest of the presenter. The presenter should remove his name badge during the ceremonial. Only the Emblem of the Order should be worn on the left lapel.

Three sizes are offered. The medium-large baldric will fit most brother knights, as its length is similar to the Fourth Degree Service Baldric. To determine a size, measure from the right shoulder of your suit jacket to your left hip.

- \* Item #30126 Size (M-L) (28" 33")
- \* Item #30127 Size (XL-XXL) (34" 39")
- \* Item #30128 Size (XXXL) (40" + )

When ordering the baldric, English (E) or French (F) version of the Emblem of the Order must be specified. The cost of the baldric for all sizes is \$25.00 (US), \$30.00 (CAN) plus shipping.

Ceremonial Baldrics may be ordered using a Form #1, from the Supply Department. The baldrics will be listed in the next printing of the Supply Catalog, under "Ceremonial Supplies."

## What Is RSVP?

RSVP stands for Refund Support Vocations Program. The Knights of Columbus launched this program in 1981. Under the RSVP program, local Knights of Columbus councils or assemblies agreed to make an annual contribution of \$500 or more to an individual seminarian to help with his expenses. Councils and assemblies can sponsor more than one seminarian if their resources permit. In each case, the minimum annual contribution is \$500 per seminarian. For every \$500 given to an individual, the Supreme Council will refund the council or assembly \$100. The maximum refund a council or assembly can receive is \$400 per individual supported. Presently 3 councils/assemblies in the Jackson Diocese have raised \$7,850, with total refunds of \$1400. These amounts are for the calendar year December 31, 2005.

On behalf of these seminarians, let me say thank you for your support. We hope you will continue participating in RSVP during the calendar year 2006.

On the Supreme level cumulative total donations since 1981 have totaled \$34,762,173. Cumulative total refunds since 1981 have totaled \$6,280,484. Cumulative total seminarians/postulants/novices assisted since 1981 have totaled 56,683. We as an Order certainly have much to be proud of in supporting these young men and women as they prepare to dedicate their lives to the service of our church.
