FIRST GOLF TOURAMENT NETS \$2,948 FOR COUNCIL ACTIVITIES

Great weather greeted the 12 teams that turned out for the first Hernando DeSoto Council golf scramble May 20 at River Bend Links. The team of David Burke, Thomas Kelley, Larry Ratliff and Henry Maxey took first place in the 4-man scramble, with the team of Rodney Newsom, Josh Newsom, Tim Tansey and Greg Lesley finishing as

runner-up. Members of both teams won gift certificates from the pro shop at River Bend Links. Additional prize winners included Thomas Kelley, closest to the pin; Chad Gatewood, longest drive; Mike Zientek, straightest drive; and Hal Fulton, putting contest. All received golf bags as prizes. Fulton offered his prize for sale at the awards dinner and contributed the \$25 he received to the Council.

The winning bid for the golf bag was submitted by Worthy Grand Knight Bill Sonnemann, who played is first-ever round of golf at the tournament using borrowed clubs. If measured by the fun he had, the tournament must be considered a success.

Brother Knights were highly visible throughout the afternoon, pitching in to register teams, conduct the putting contest and serve as witnesses for the hole-in-one contest.

Approximately 90 guests were treated to a steak and chicken dinner contributed by Outback Steakhouse of Southaven. The event served as an awards dinner and a Religious Appreciation event, with six priests and 10 sisters

in attendance. The Council presented each of the priests and nuns with Outback gift cards as a gesture of appreciation for their service in the parishes served by the Priests of the Sacred Heart.

Country Ford of Southaven joined Outback Steakhouse as the event's corporate sponsors, offering a new Ford vehicle as the hole-in-one prize, which went unclaimed. The Council netted \$2,948 for its church, family and youth activities, priest education programs and the overall mission of Christ the King Parish in Horn Lake and Southaven.

APPLICATION FOR 2007 MISSISSIPPI KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS BBQ COOK-OFF

Why? To raise money and awareness for Pro-life Organizations and to have fun. When? Event is Saturday August 4th, 2007; setup can start Friday night August 3rd. Where? St. Joe Catholic High School, Madison, Mississippi.

Competition: There will be three different categories (Brisket, Chicken & Pork ribs) to compete in. A team may compete in one, two or all three. There will be a 1st, 2nd and 3rd place for each category and then an overall winner. Entry fees: \$100 to enter any one category, \$175 to enter any two categories or \$250 to enter all three categories.

Rules:

- ⇒ There should be no more than eight men to a team
- ⇒ All entries must be cooked on charcoal or wood or both
- ⇒ All entry meats are to be cold at the site to be inspected
- ⇒ No entry meats are to be injected but plain raw meat to start with
- ⇒ No entry is to be cooked before the contest
- ⇒ NO butane is to be used to cook with, but may be used for starting wood or charcoal
- ⇒ The blind boxes on all entries must have enough to feed ten to twelve judges
- ⇒ All teams must use leg quarters for the chicken category
- ⇒ All entries may have sauce with entries or not
- ⇒ If entries have sauce, it must be marked hot if so.
