A WORD FROM OUR STATE DEPUTY

Worthy State Officers, District Deputies, Grand Knights, and fellow Knights of the Mississippi Jurisdiction:

As we embark on a new journey into the future, let's us not forget how we got to where we are today. It was the hard work and dedication of our Past State Deputies and Committee chairmen. We thank them for all their contributions and should always remember them in our prayers.

In order for us to grow and prosper, it is imperative that we set goals, have worthwhile programs and establish good communications.

Goals:

Membership:

In order for our membership to grow, we need our intake to be more than output. This past Supreme year (July 1 through June 30) we took in 333 new members and 50 re-entries for a total of 383. This was a good thing. On the negative side, we, sadly, had 93 deaths (which do not count against us), suspended 133 and had 31 withdrawals for a total of 164. This means that in order for us to gain 219, we had to take in 383. Our goal for the year is 350. Based on the last 5 years statistics, this means that we need to get 550 new members in order to attain our goal. The deaths, we have no control over. But, the suspensions we can control. IPSD Larry Tabor has graciously accepted the challenge of Retention chairman. In this position, Larry will be working with State Membership chairman, Billy Waggoner. Also, assisting Billy with membership will be Ron Kopaz, North Regional membership chairman, and Joe Jones as Central membership chairman with assist from Bob Leo in the East Central region.

Programs

In order for us to retain our members, it is imperative that we have programs for our members, not members for our programs. Our Program chairman for this year is **Noel Aucoin**

Communications:

One of the keys to our success is good communications. We feel that in order to achieve good Communications, it is imperative that there be representation in both Dioceses. Public Relations will be chaired by Noel Aucoin with Fred Middleton as Jackson Diocese chairman, and Elvis Gates as Biloxi Diocese chairman. Any newsworthy articles can be funneled through Fred, in the Jackson Diocese and Elvis in the Biloxi Diocese. Our Hispanic Outreach Chairman is Pascual Cruz. Pascual has 4 years experience as District Deputy in Texas. Our State Webb site will once again be manned by Greg Rottman and Tony Dardeau. The very capable Mike Kassouf will chair the State Directory. The State Webb site, State directory, and Magnolia Knight are key to our communications. We understand that some Grand Knights, Committee chairman, etc. may not have computers. For those it is imperative that you have someone in your council as a designee to receive your e-mails or request that your information be mailed.

THE BILOXI DIOCESE KNIGHTS TEAMS WITH SERRA

A joint meeting was held with the Serra Club of Biloxi and the Mississippi Knights of Columbus on June 20, 2007, at the Biloxi Diocesan Pastoral Center.

The following agreement was derived from that meeting:

Serra Club of Biloxi and Mississippi Knights of Columbus Join in collaborative Parish Vocation Awareness
There is a clear need to increase priestly vocations not only in the Diocese('s) of Mississippi, but nation-wide: A fifteen year projection, which considers age, retirement, and attrition, anticipates a shortage of priests which may result n some parishes without resident priests. To help alleviate the shortage of priest vocations, the Serra Club of Biloxi and the Mississippi Knights of Columbus have joined in a collaborative effort to implement Vocation program activities. In a joint meeting, the Serra Club of Biloxi and the Knights of Columbus adopted the Mission Statement below to describe this collaborative relationship.

Mission Statement

"In the spirit of Blessed Junipero Serra and Father Michael J. McGivney we join together to foster and affirm an awareness of vocations to the ordained priesthood and consecrated religious life within our schools and parishes and through this our members common catholic faith."
