A WORD FROM OUR STATE DEPUTY

Worthy State Officers, District Deputies, Grand Knights, and fellow Knights of the Mississippi Jurisdiction:

We are now in the season of Lent, the time for fasting, sacrifice, and forgiving. I would ask you to forgive someone in your life that you may hold a grudge against. If there is no one, you are truly blessed. If there is, remember that Jesus forgave those that persecuted Him. In "The Lord's Prayer" we ask God to forgive us our trespasses as we forgive <u>those</u> who trespass against us. If we expect God to forgive us, we must forgive them.

The State Convention is quickly approaching and there are pressing issues that must be answered. One of the most pressing issues is the State raffle. To date, in the Jackson Diocese, only \$1300 has been turned in and less than that in the Biloxi Diocese. I have asked the District Deputies to check with each of their councils to get an accounting of tickets sold. Now, I am asking each council to contact their DD's and give them this information. Brothers, we really need to push these ticket sales. I realize that some councils are having their own fund raisers and I applaud them. However, this raffle is important because we can expand our base of fund raising to the State level. I was recently asked to cancel the raffle. I am not because I have faith in my brother Knights and we are not quitters. Remember that this Raffle is for Priest Education, come through for them.

At the Regional Mid-Winter meetings, State convention packets were passed-out. These included the Registration and ad forms. If you did not receive them, they are available on the State Web site. The Convention Committee needs you to get them in ASAP in order to plan a successful convention.

Membership: So far, we have been fairly successful in recruitment and initiations. However, we are not very successful in retention. In order for us to grow and spread Columbianism we need success in both areas. When we initiate 40 new members and receive 15 or 20 suspensions (from one council) we are not growing. We are <u>maintaining</u>. March is the time for the March Blitz campaign. Please get your membership materials from Supreme now. They can be ordered from Supreme using the supply catalog.

May Jesus' blessing be with you and your family during this Lenten season.

The Deacons Candidates asked for help in cooking during the weekends of their theology studies held at the Sacred Heart Cursillio Center in Dedeaux, Mississippi. The Knights of Columbus of the Biloxi Diocese graciously accepted the task. Other groups have also volunteered their time in the kitchen. These councils and groups will be cooking the once a month until ordination in 2009.



SCOUTING RELIGIOUS AWARDS

During the past year the Jackson Diocese has re-instituted a diocesan Catholic Committee on Scouting. Among the Committee's goals is to encourage Catholic Cub Scout Packs and Boy Scout Troops to participate in the National Catholic Quality Unit Award program, and to encourage individual scouts to achieve the Catholic Religious Awards at their age levels.

The Knights of Columbus have had a long history of supporting Scouting both in Mississippl and throughout the country. The Catholic Committee wants to encourage that support, not only by asking Councils to directly sponsor Catholic Troops and Packs but in other ways as well. State Warden Jim McGraw brought to the Catholic Committee's attention, that many years ago Council # 848 in Jackson had paid for the religious medals and awards earned by Catholic Cub Scouts (Light of Christ and Parvuli Del awards) and Catholic Boy Scouts (Ad Altare Dei and Pope Pius XII).

The Catholic Committee Is now asking every council in the diocese to consider starting a program in their area to encourage Scouts to earn these awards by actually purchasing the medals and awards for the scouts. In January Council 7120 in Southaven paid for and presented three Light of Christ awards to Cub Scouts in Pack 190 in Southaven, and Council 6765 in Starkville has done the same for eight Cub Scouts who have earned the Parvuli Dei awards in Starkville. On May 18, Council 848 will continue their old tradition by providing medals for six Boy Scouts from Troop 30 who have earned the Ad Altare Dei awards, and Pack 30 Cub Scouts who earned the Parvuli Dei and the Light of Christ awards. The Knights Council 848 also plans to participate in the award ceremony at St. Richard Catholic Church.

The Jackson Diocesan Catholic Committee on Scouting asks that each Council in the diocese contact the Catholic sponsored troops and packs in their areas and promise to support the Scouts participation in the religious award program by defraying the cost of the medals. We will also be seeking ways that we can expand participation in the religious awards program to individual Catholic scouts who are not in Catholic sponsored troops or packs. If your Council would like to participate in this program please contact Tom Chady, Catholic Committee Liasion to the Knights of Columbus, or Kathie Curtis, Diocesan Director of Youth Ministries.

The Starkville Council recently took up a special collection at all the masses at it's parish and forwarded \$200 per seminarian to the Diocese of Jackson. To my knowledge, and that of Fr. Kent Bowlds, this is the first time ever for such an endeavor.
