### Late Push Needed For Gerow Fund Raising

Just a few days remain before we assemble for the State Convention in Jackson. Donations to the Bishop R.O. Gerow Memorial Fund are coming in, but not at the rate I had hoped and prayed for.

As you recall, I challenged all Councils, Assemblies and Ladies Auxiliaries at the mid-year meetings to make a donation so we could reach our support goal for priest education.

As of April 11, we had received \$23,367.24 for the Biloxi Diocese and \$6,910 for the Jackson Diocese. This equates to donations from approximately 50 percent of the Councils in the Biloxi Diocese and 15 percent of the Jackson Diocese Councils. This is a long way from our goal.

I challenge those Councils, Assemblies and Ladies Auxiliaries that have not made a contribution. Even in these difficult economic times, we must remember our commitment to support the educational pursuits of our priests.

The deadline for contributing to the current year's drive is April 18. Donations made by Councils at the State Convention will not be counted in the current year but will be go to the 2009-10 Fraternal Year fund-raising effort. Please make every effort to see that contributions made in the next few days meet the deadline to help us with the current year's drive.


### State Convention: A Time for Sharing

### April Is Organ Donor Month By Raymond Cole

April is designated as Organ Donor Month, a perfect time to arrange for your Council or your Parish to host a blood drive. Blood is an important component for life and an easily replaceable organ for those of us healthy enough to donate.

Check with the blood collection agency in your area to arrange a date for the drive and do your part to promote and encourage participation. With enough donors, your entire Council or Parish can be protected for an entire year. Even if you don't get that many donors, each donor and his/her family are protected for an entire year. This is something we can each do for each other and for our church family.

It should also be noted that it is never too late to have a speaker at Sunday Masses to encourage those present to sign up as organ donors. Remind the parishioners that all they have to do is go to their Driver's License Renewal office and have a new license made--with the little heart on it designating them as an organ donor.

They can choose which organs they specifically want to donate or can designate simply that medical personnel use whatever organs are suitable for donation. As many as 50 people can be helped by the organs from one donor.

Remember, this is truly the gift of life in its finest form. What the donor will never be able to use again will certainly give others a chance at a new life. As Christians, this is our finest gift and a last chance to help others on this earth.
