A Word from the State Deputy Let's Make These Final Months of the Year Our Best By Peter J. Sukanek

Those of you who attended our State Convention in Natchez a few weeks ago can attest to what a good experience that was. I would like to thank once again the Natchez Council for their hard work in putting on a successful convention. We all appreci-

ate your effort and dedication.

Another thank you goes to the convention delegates who reelected me as State Deputy for my second term. It is truly an honor for me to represent Mississippi and all the many important programs you do for the Church, your com-

munities and the world. Let me mention a few here.

The primary principle of our Order is Charity, and we have done an outstanding job in that area. In September 2009, a typhoon hit the Philippines. Later, in January 2010, a devastating earthquake struck Haiti. Both countries were, and still are, in severe distress. Many Mississippi Councils provided financial support for both of these disasters. We are called to assist the poor and the most vulnerable in our society. You have done that with programs to raise money and materials for local food pantries and supplied the manpower to work there. You have held numerous fundraisers and collected materials to support local pregnancy crisis centers. You have sponsored programs to pray for an end to abortion. Several Councils sponsored pro-life programs for the parish and the local community with invited speakers from statewide pro-life organizations. This past year, our Program for People with Intellectual Disabilities (PID Program or "Tootsie

Roll Drive") brought in about \$71,000 which was distributed to organizations throughout the state to help people with physical and mental disabilities. This year's Bishop Gerow fund raised \$91,813 to assist in the education of our seminarians.

Councils have sponsored many excellent programs in the six activity areas of the Knights. You have visited local hospitals and held Christmas parties for the children there. You visited veterans' homes and retirement homes, and prepared a special meal for the residents, or just spent some time with them talking

and sharing stories. You distributed Christmas baskets, helping make a happy time for many families that would otherwise have had little to eat and no presents for the children. You helped homeless veterans on the coast by collecting and distributing personal hygiene products. You celebrated family life with cookouts and campouts. You supported your parishes by raising money for the building projects, or by doing the building yourselves. You helped the widows of departed brother Knights by fixing up their homes.

You did all these and many more activities not because you had to, not because you were looking for some reward, but because they were the right thing to do, because if you did not do them, no one else would. I congratulate you.

We are now moving into the last months of our fraternal year. Let's make certain they are the best of the year.

Bishop Gerow Fund Contributes \$91,813

The Bishop Gerow Fund for priest education netted \$91,813 during the 2009-10 Fraternal Year, with checks presented to the Diocese of Jackson for \$48,341 and to the Diocese of Biloxi for \$43,472 during the State Convention in Natchez.

"It was another successful year for the Bishop Gerow Fund," said Chair Don Cox in his report to delegates. "My sincere thanks goes to all who worked so hard to provide funds to support the education of our seminarians."

Leading the way in the collection of funds in the Jackson Diocese were Meridian Council 802 with \$11,380; Greenville/Leland Assembly 555 with \$1,500; and Ladies Auxiliaries Greenville/Leland 2134 and Clinton 7854 with \$500.

The leading contributors in the Biloxi Diocese were Picayune Council 6872 and Assembly 2227 with \$6,010 and \$2,734, respectively; and D'Iberville Ladies Auxiliary 9094 with \$500.

"There were only seven Councils in each Diocese who did not make a donation," Chairman Cox noted. "To these Councils, I suggest one function to raise funds for this worthwhile cause in the coming year. To those Councils who made donations, I encourage you to keep up the good work of the past."

The northern School of Columbianism will be on Sunday, July 11.


