narian Education for the Military Archdiocese and a new 2<sup>nd</sup> Responders program designed to help with disaster relief throughout the country. Our State Programs Chairman, Elvis Gates, will be discussing them in detail at our Mid-Winter Re-

gional meetings next month.

We worked hard but had some fun, too. The meetings ended with a dinner/ dance on Saturday night with a "Western" theme. Linda did us

proud by wearing her black cowboy hat with a ceramic magnolia in the front. It was interesting to watch the Supreme Officers, many in jeans, boots and cowboy hats, trying to line dance.

Last July, Supreme told us that any state reaching 45 percent of its recruitment goal by Dec. 31 will get \$2,000 deposited into its Christopher Fund account. For those who do not know, the Christopher Funds is a Supreme-sponsored program. The money we put into the Christopher Fund is invested, and every year each Diocese receives a check for the interest accrued. These checks are presented at convention time along with our Bishop Gerow contributions. As of Dec. 9, we still need 23 new Knights to get that money. Our State Membership Chairman tells me he has three Form 100s ready to send in and two District Deputies tell me that between them they have another 11 ready for exemplifications. That's good, but it still leaves us short. This is free money that will help benefit our Seminarians for years to come. We need to make one final push. Please do what you can to make this happen.

The State Officer's meeting was held Dec. 3 and was attended by the State Officers, District Deputies, State Program Chairman, State Youth Chairman and the State Ceremonials Chairman. We discussed the status of each District as well as where we are in relation to our State goals and made plans on how to get them accomplished by the end of the year. Overall we are doing well. Our recruitment is up slightly from last year, but, as in past years, we are still having retention problems. We seem to be losing Knights as fast as we are bringing them in.

Also at this meeting we were introduced to a potentially new program. Some members of the Vicksburg Council are part of an effort to form a non-profit organization designed to help homeless veterans. While the program is just getting started, it appears to be a worthwhile project. We will be presenting information to you on this later to see if your Councils are interested in participating.

Our Regional Mid-Winter meetings are rapidly approaching. This year we will have our Southern Regional Meeting on Sunday, Jan. 8, at Council 5654, Ocean Springs. Our Northern meeting will be on Saturday, Jan. 14, at Council 13502, Batesville, and our Central meeting will be Sunday, Jan. 15, at St. Richard's Council 15131 in Jackson. The St. Richard's meeting will start at 1 p.m. All others will start at noon. While all are encouraged to attend, we would like to see all Grand Knights, Program Directors and Membership Directors at the meetings.

Linda and I would like to thank you for your friendship and support this past year. We wish all of you a prayerful, joyous Christmas and New Year. May 2012 will bring you and your families many blessings.
