By now I'm sure all of you know about the latest ruling from the US Department of Health and Human Services declaring that employers. including Catholic employers, will be forced to offer their employees health coverage that includes sterilization, abortion-inducing drugs and contraception. This has a tremendous effect on all of us Catholics. Accordingly, the US Council of Catholic Bishops has taken a stand against the ruling. Supreme Knight Carl Anderson sent a personal letter to all Grand Knights asking that we support our Bishops. The recent "compromise" offered by President Obama is, in the terms of a recent CNN article, nothing more than a "bait and switch." While the words have changed, the intent and mean-

# ISSUE AGE RAISED TO 80 FOR K OF C INSURANCE BY JERRY WOODS

When I started as an agent with the K of C the maximum age for obtaining insurance was 65. A few years later, that was increased to 70, then to 75. Since January, the issue age for whole life insurance is 80.

This is tremendous – anyone between the ages of 75 and 80 can apply for whole life insurance in our Order. No longer can anyone between those ages say they cannot apply for insurance in our Order. Of course, the application is subject to underwriting regulations.

This opens up a new area for Councils to achieve their insurance quota.
