The Silver Rose Comes to Mississippi



The Silver Rose will start its journey in Mississippi traveling over 1100 miles throughout the Jurisdiction Starting Sunday September 7th. Meridian Council 802 will initiate the first service at St. Joseph Catholic Church at 4:30 pm. It will end its Mississippi journey in Picayune Council 6872 where it will be handed over to Louisiana as it advances to its final destination at the Our Lady of Guadalupe Basilica in Mexico. State Deputy Jim McCraw will participate in a televised Mass at EWTN Sunday Morning September 7, where He and Alabama State Deputy Pete Parish will bring the Silver Rose in at the beginning of Mass and place it on the pillow in front of the assembly.

The Our Lady of Guadalupe Silver Rose Program began in 1960 as a project of the Columbian Squires of North America to honor the Blessed Virgin under her title of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas. The program has continued since then as a project of Squires circles, councils and Fourth Degree assemblies in several jurisdictions. In 2001, Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson expanded the program by beginning the "Running of the Rose" from the 119th Annual Meeting of the Supreme Council in Ontario. Today six Silver Roses travel from Canada to the United States to Monterrey, Mexico, arriving at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe there on Dec. 12, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

In earlier years the one rose was run from London, Ontario, through 10 states in the United States, and then crossing at the International Bridge and ending in Monterrey, Mexico. Now six roses travel simultaneously.

Starting April, six roses will travel simultaneously through 53 states and provinces before entering Mexico for the final leg of the pilgrimage to Monterrey.

"The 'Running of the Rose' is a perfect program for the Knights of Columbus," said Supreme Knight Anderson. "Through it we honor not only Our Lady of Guadalupe and express the unity of the Order, but we also reaffirm the Order's dedication to the sanctity of human life. It is to the Blessed Mother that we turn in prayer as we work to end the Culture of Death that grips our society. As we think in terms of 'One Life, One Rose,' it is most appropriate that we turn to Our Lady of Guadalupe who made known her will through Juan Diego and the 'Miracle of the Roses.' "

"Through the Silver Rose Program the Knights of Mississippi show our support for the Church and its bishops and priests as we pray for the continued strength to do so in these trouble times. The Silver Rose also symbolizes our commitment to restoring respect for the sanctity of human life from conception until natural death. As we think in terms of 'One Life, One Rose,' it is most appropriate that we turn to Our Lady of Guadalupe who made known her will through Juan Diego and the miracle of the roses," said Jim McCraw, State Deputy, chief executive of the Knights of Columbus in Mississippi.

The Round Table Corner

Does your Council serve or have members from multiple parishes? Does your parish have any nearby parishes that do not currently have a Knights of Columbus presence?

Across the State of MS we have currently 154 parish or mission churches and 61 current councils. The difference between these two numbers is the opportunity we have to bring Knights of Columbus to the remaining parishes, assistance to the Pastors and Priests that serve multiple parishes, and works of charity and service to our brothers and sisters in Christ.

A parish round table is an extension and part of a Council that helps support the individual needs of the nearby parish through local activities, service and ministry. For example Council 7120 in Southaven supports currently three parish round tables at Holy Spirit in Hernando, St. Gregory the Great in Senatobia, and Good Shepherd in Robinsonville/Tunica. In Northwest MS, Catholics are a very small minority of the population so we are bonded together in faith as one Catholic community. The Council activities bring us together as Brothers and members of the parish round tables schedule local parish events (spaghetti dinners, Lenten fish fry's, Family social nights, service projects, etc.) at their own parishes based on their individual needs.

More information on parish round tables will be sent in the coming weeks to your Worthy Grand Knights, Church Activity Directors, and District Deputies. Just as a circle has no beginning and end, this article will continue over future newsletters to highlight happenings with current parish round tables and announce new ones that have been formed. So I end with an excited to be continued....
