State Ceremonials Chairman, Jerry Schmuck reports we now have 4 Conferring Officers: Rich Lieding, Paul Mitchell, Peter Sukanek and Bill Jarrett, plus one more in training. On March 26, Council 15131 in Jackson is hosting a 3<sup>rd</sup> degree. That's a Thursday night. Because our degrees are separated, we have a lot more flexibility in where and when we can conduct these beautiful and edifying ceremonials.

March is an ideal time for district meetings. Your DD will help you get all of your paperwork and reports squared away, answer questions about delegates, necrology, best activity, and things first time convention attendees need to know. They will provide you with a preconvention checklist.

We'll talk about the convention next month, in the mean time, select your delegates, get them registered, order your convention ad and have your banner spruced up for the Friday night *Grand Procession of Banners*. Biloxi is going all out to make sure this is a great experience.

I'd like to take a moment to speak to our council trustees.

The Board of Trustees serves as the watchdog for council finances and make up the Retention Committee. Most of you are past grand knights. You know all or most of the members personally and will use that relationship to address delinquent dues in a fraternal manner. You encourage the council to maintain good contact with all

members so they feel united even if they are homebound.

It's very important to serve as mentors for the grand knight, particularly in his first year. It is normal for him to make some of the same mistakes you did. The key is to take the responsibility and, in private, share your experience. It is easy to sit back and point fingers. It is hard to swallow our pride, realizing our advice might be rejected. Your example will not be forgotten. It's how we develop Catholic leaders.

Let me close by congratulating our State Chaplain, Monsignor Elvin Sunds for his dedicated service to the Diocese of Jackson as Vicar General and welcome him back into the role of parish priest. Former State Chaplain, Fr. Kevin Slattery has been appointed the new Vicar General for the Diocese of Jackson.

Lent is a time of sacrifice, reflection and prayer. I ask that you remember the Egyptian martyrs, the Holy Father and Christians of all faiths in the Middle East and everywhere religious freedom is attacked.

I remind you of the power of the rosary and urge you to pray it as a group, with your family and alone.

Members of Philadelphia Council 13471 presented check for \$100.00 with a commitment to continue to support Philadelphia's Crisis Pregnancy Center.


