From the desk of the State Deputy, Noel Aucoin



Brothers,

Greetings to you all. I pray that you all had a Blessed Christmas Season and are looking forward to a Christ filled New Year. The Mid-winter meetings are through and all Grand Knights should have a plan for the second half of the Fraternal Year.

As reported at the Mid-winter meetings, the State is doing fairly well in our march to reach our Supreme Membership Goals. At the time this was written, we were at 48% of the Intake Goal and was ranked number 13, Order wide. Although we are in pretty good shape,

we are behind where we were this time last year. In order to help boost membership, we have put into place a couple of programs that we hope will aid your council's efforts. First we have reached to both Bishops and they responded to our request. Bishop Kihneman and Bishop Kopacz have agreed to draft letters and send them to every Pastor in their respective Dioceses. The letters will be encouraging the Pastors to promote Knights of Columbus membership, from the pulpit, in each of their Parishes. I urged each Council to touch base with the Pastor of the Parishes they serve and coordinate a membership drive on the same weekend that the Priest plan his pulpit talk. Please take advantage of the Bishops' effort. I personally sent letters to each Grand Knight out lining this effort. Again, please take advantage!!

Secondly, I have approve the "Star Council Steak Dinner" program again this year. The only difference this year is that we extended the time frame to achieve this status. All Councils have until April 15 to gain Star Council status. Upon attaining this goal, your Council will be eligible to receive a Steak Dinner for your entire Council and families prepared by members of the State Family. This was a highly successful program last Fraternal Year and we hope to have even more dinners to cook this year.

Last Fraternal Year we accomplished something unprecedented. We reached back-to-back Circle of Honor Status by two different State Deputies. We had record setting Star Council numbers. Can we achieve another "never been done before". The State has never received three Circle of Honor Awards in a row. Supreme is finally taking notice of our great state. Let's keep it going. Remember if your Council needs State Family help with your membership drives contact State Secretary, Philip Jabour, for scheduling.

Convention time is nearing and will be here before we know it. I have included a "Convention Check List" in this issue of the Magnolia Knight. I hope you will find it helpful while preparing for the event. Hope to see you there.

The 2018 Annual State meeting of the Mississippi Jurisdiction of the Knights of Columbus is only two months away! Have you reregistered yet? If not, please do so at your earliest convenience, deadline is March 31st. There is additional costs after the deadline. Has your council, assembly, or ladies auxiliary purchased an ad for the convention booklet? If not, please do so as soon as possible but not later than March 31st. Money raised through convention booklet ads help pay for incidentals' conventioneers expect and deserve. Have you ordered your convention golf shirt yet? Again, deadline is March 31st. 
C. Mark Landry Assembly 3007





Council 9673 recently led a St. Mary, Woolmarket, parish-wide drive to supply household paper goods (toilet paper and paper towels) to the emergency pantry of our Harrison County Senior Resources Agency. The Agency screens applicants for "Meals on Wheels" and, when visiting the senior, may find appalling conditions like a lack of food, cleaning supplies, cooking supplies and such. If the senior is receiving assistance on the SNAP, formerly "Food Stamps," they cannot use that for paper products, so there is a general need for toilet tissue and other disposable paper goods. The Agency was overwhelmed with this supply and predicts it will last one year. We plan to have this event annually.
