Duties of a IPSD

Immediate Past State Deputy, Noel Aucoin has been a Knight for 22 years. He has been married to his lovely wife, Patty, for 39 years and they have two children. A daughter, Jessica and son, Drew. They currently have one grandson, Gunner. Brother Noel has held every office in his original Council, 9094, D'Iberville and is currently the Financial Secretary for his new Council 16992, Biloxi. Noel was the Charter Faithful Navigator for his Assembly 3007, D'Ibervile. He started his state involvement under his friend and mentor, Larry Tabor, as State Council Director. Brother Noel also served as State Public Relations Chairman, State Program Director and State Membership Director before starting his journey through the State Officers' Chairs. Another of one the earlier post Noel served as was Editor of the Magnolia Knight. This assignment he has happily excepted again and is currently producing it monthly.

Noel has been employed at Ingalls Shipbuilding for 34 years and currently manages the Scheduling team for large deck amphibious ships. He represents the shipyard on the advisory board of the South Mississippi United Way. Noel and Patty are members of St. Michael's parish in Biloxi and serves there as an Extraordinary Minister and on the Parish Advisory Board. He is also a board member of the Mississippi Special Olympics. Noel was selected as a 2019 inductee into the Society of the Fleur de Lis.

Noel notes that the highlights of his term as State Deputy was back to back Circle of Honor awards, the placement of two ultrasound machines and the establishment of two new Councils. He acknowledges that none of these accomplishments would be possible without the hard work and support of his team of Officers, District Deputies and the Councils.

Life as Past State Deputy has slowed down quite a bit but Noel plans to continue serving the Mississippi Knights of Columbus in some capacity.

The responsibilities of a Immediate Past State Deputy is somewhat similar to that of a Council Trustee without the responsibility of an semi-annual audit. State audit must be done by a Certified Public Accountant. The Immediate Past State Deputy is a voting member of the Officers' team and is chief advisor to the State Deputy. Although an important voice, the IPSD's activities is much less than his previous offices. The position is not an elected position (as is the Trustee) but an office earned by virtue of completed term(s) at State Deputy.





Membership Message

Travel mugs have been sent out to Kenny Robbins of St. Richards Council 15131, Basil Richmond and Jacob Eftink of Oxford Council 10901, and David Browman of St. Paul Council 10216. They each recruited a new member for their council. Overall the state recruited 21 new members during the month of November with a net gain of 11 for the month. Currently the state has brought 112 new members this fraternal year and that is low. We are at 31% of our goal, and almost halfway through the year. We have a lot of work in the coming months to achieve circle of honor.

Council with asterisks next to their number also did not recruit a member in the 2018-19 year. The average Knight in Mississippi is 57 years old and has been a Knight for 16 years. 46% of Mississippi KC members are over the age of 60. The council with the oldest average members is Sacred Heart Council 12166 with an average age of 68. That council is also one of those that hasn't brought in a new member in at least 18 months. Councils that aren't bringing in new members are slowly dying. Two of the councils in the not-recruiting list made Star Council last year, 8038, and 14051. Another two earned the Father McGivney award for membership last year, 8760 and 9409.

Clearly there are men out there who want to become Knights. Where are they? Two groups of men that are underrepresented in the Mississippi Knights of Columbus are young men, and Minority/Ethnic groups. To reach these, councils need to make the Knights relevant to them. Men today are busy with family, work, and church. They want to make a difference in their world. Are councils in this state ready to help them? Do they have programs that build stronger families, families with a volunteer ethic? Do they have programs that help men make a difference in their church, more than ushering or lecturing? Do they have programs that empower men to make a difference in their communities? Do they have members who are willing to mentor younger men to help them in their careers and to become better husbands and fathers? Gone are the days when a council could sit on their laurels and exist as just a men's club. Councils now need to be not only inviting to families but encourage family involvement in their programs. Councils that do these things become inviting to younger men and families
