I believe he was installed in Mexico City about 20 years ago. So, this is a significant convention. I need your help to make our new member numbers by the end of June. First Delegate should be the current Grand Knight, the second delegate should be the Immediate Past Grand Knight.

Alternate delegates should be selected the Council past Grand Knights. If for reason the IPGK or PGK are not available then a 3rd degree council member can be selected.

MEMBERSHIP MESSAGE January Membership Report

Travel Mugs are being sent to Thomas Whitenton and James Parman of Council 8848 in Tupelo. I still have one travel mug left. As of February 12th, statewide, 139 new members have joined the Mississippi Knights of Columbus. 48 have been dropped or have withdrawn. The state is 59th in the order in intake gain and 50th in net gain. The state needs 222 new members to reach circle of honor. If each council brings in one new member per month between now and the end of June, the state will make circle of honor. It will also means that at least 26 councils will have reached their membership goal and could potentially make Star council. As of the end of January, 7 councils have met their state recruiting goals with two of those meeting their Top Gun goal for the year.

To encourage councils to meet this goal, the state has opened to new recruiting initiatives. For every council that recruits 4 new members between February 1st and March 31st, the state will reimburse the council for one delegate's convention registration fee. If a council brings in eight new members, the council will be reimbursed for both delegates. For every council that makes Star Council, the state will provide a ½ year credit in their state per capita. Supreme will also provide a Star Councils a ½ year credit in their Supreme per capita.

Dear Brother Knights

As you know the convention is rapidly approaching - and time is running out for your contribution to the Bishop Houck Religious Retirement Fund. This fund was established in 2016 for providing funds to help our religious with their retirement. The first year we gave the fund a little over \$ 5,000 – the following year we gave a little over \$8,000 and last year we gave almost \$12,000 – the goal this year is \$14,000, so since the beginning of this fund we have donated \$25,000.

As the fraternal year rapidly draws to a close we are very behind in our donations by the councils- so far this year we have raised only \$2,200 and I am concerned. I realize that you are asked by a lot of funds to donate to their cause, and they are worthy of your consideration; however the Bishop Houck Fund for Retired Religious is a little different from most.

If you were unable to contribute last year please do so this year, and if you did contribute last year please try and increase your contribution this year.
