This is a speech given at one of the mid-winter meetings by State Deputy Executive Secretary Robert Barr:

I want to take a few minutes today to talk with you about a young man who went out of his comfort zone to help change the world a bit.

This story started many years ago, but in many ways it is a story that can be tied to any age. There are always those who look down on a group or person and because of their own issues try to make that person or group into a pariah in society.

In 1879, it was the waves of Catholics emigrating in from Europe that caught the eye of many. These immigrants often faced bigotry, exclusion, and uncharitable situations in American society. They often had to work in jobs that were dangerous and less desirable.

On August 12, 1852, Blessed Michael J. McGivney was born into such a family. He was the oldest in a family of thirteen, of which only seven would survive their childhood. He completed his primary education at thirteen and then worked in factories for a few years to help his family before he pursued his calling to the priesthood. Unfortunately, Father McGivney's father passed away while he was in the seminary, and he had to return home to support his family once again.

How many times in our own lives have we had tragedies or issues that came up that have kept us from moving forward and using our own personal talents to do more than the 9 to 5 standard of living? We all have our Comfort Zone. We feel we deserve it. We worked hard and now it is time for our self. But what is self? Are we allotted only a certain number breaths, actions, thoughts, per day?


Now Father McGivney's story could have ended when he returned to help support his family, but his calling was strong and with the help of the Bishop of Hartford, Connecticut he returned to complete his studies and was ordained on December 2, 1877. Once a Priest, Father McGivney realized that there were many in his congregation who had similar problems to what he experienced during his youth. Asking a group of men in his parish to step out of their comfort zones he help found the Widows and Orphans Fund that would later become the insurance program the Knights of Columbus enjoys today, but I doubt he stopped there. I am sure that he asked the women of the parish to help with projects, too.

We all have comfort zones and abilities. If we could all learn to expand our comfort zone to include more Faith, Family, Life, and Community actions in our daily lives, we would we do the work of Christ and maybe feel a little better about ourselves each day.

Blessed Michael J. McGivney Guild

Are you a member of the McGivney Guild? If you are I say thank you for your membership. If you are not I can't help but wonder why. There is no cost to become a member and the sole function of the Guild is to serve as a source of information about the life, works and spirituality of our Founder.

Pope Francis approved a decree for a miracle attributed to his intercession, opening the way for Father McGivney beatification on Oct. 31, 2020. A second miracle, after the date of his Beatification, must be approved before he can be canonized as a saint of the Catholic Church.

Father McGivney died of pneumonia at the age of 38 during an outbreak of the Russian flu. So today, as you pray a rosary for your family or friends, consider inviting Blessed Father McGivney to pray the rosary with you. This method of praying is based on our Lady's promise that devotees of the Rosary will have for its intercessor the entire heavenly court.

What to consider in the search for the "Family of the Month"?

- Is the family tight-knit? Does the family spend quality time together?
- Does the family attend weekly Mass together? Does the family pray together outside of Mass?
- Has the family made significant contributions to the parish and church community?
- Does the family serve as a model of Catholic family values?
- Does the family spend its time together interacting instead of in front of the television set?
- Six of 12 Families chosen can be non-KC member families. The other six must be KC.
- Family of the Year submission must be a KC Family.












Knights in Action
