From the State Membership Director

Brothers all, I hope this finds you all in good health and active in your council's road to the Star Award. We have a lot of things going to help stimulate the councils in achieving their recruiting goals.

You should have received the following announcements from your District Deputies: the three \$100 drawings at the convention, the \$50 year-end award, and finally the District Deputy recruitment belt.

We have welcomed 184 new members so far, which is 53% of our 342-member intake goal, with three months to go in the Fraternal year.

We also have 18 councils within reach of the Star Award. This could be a record if we can bring it home. Of those 18, ten are lacking one or two reports and maybe one or two members. Currently, the Jurisdiction has no designated Star Award coordinator, so I have been assigned the honor. Along with our E-Membership Chairman, Gary Owchar, I will be advising you of the outstanding requirements needed to complete the award.

Among the many tools available, such as Proof of Concept programs, OCIA, and point-to-point contact, there is now a K of C demographic report. This, among other things, gives the each county's population of Catholic males ages 18 to 80 that are not Knights. Per the report, Mississippi currently contains over 55,000 potential members and we only need 160. That's .0029% of what's out there.

In conclusion, take the initiative, ask for support if you need it, and remember it is all about the numbers. The number of men that can become better fathers, closer to Christ, better citizens and better husbands. Those are numbers to be proud of.

From the State Secretary

This month I am going to focus on the various reports that we ask for throughout the year.

The first two reports are the “Report of Officers Chosen for the Term” (form 185) and “Service Program Personnel Report” (form 365). These forms are due by June 30th. These two forms identify for Supreme your council officers and program chairmen. Both are needed by Supreme to determine who needs background checks and training for Safe Environment certification. Both can be done prior to the end of the fraternal year in June and should be done online using Member Management.

Ideally, the current Grand Knight or financial secretary should enter these two reports. If done prior to the end of the fraternal year, the current slate of personnel can be copied into the next fraternal year, and only those positions that have changed will need to be updated. If these are not done before the end of the fraternal year, all council positions are reset.

Once they are completed, a copy of each report is available in the Print Center in Member Management. These need to be downloaded and sent to the state. Many councils have entered this information for Supreme, however, only four councils have submitted form 185 and only one council has submitted form 365 to the state. The state needs this report to know the leaders in the council.

The next report due is the annual audit, currently due on August 15th. (Supreme has eliminated the audit due in February.) This report is used to verify the council finances, and should be filled out by the council trustees and Grand Knight with input from the financial secretary and the council treasurer. Again, a copy should be sent to the state. The state maintains this copy and if Supreme loses its copy, the state can resubmit it to Supreme.

The next report due is the “Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity” (form 1728). This reports the charitable work done by your council. Supreme uses this information to maintain the nonprofit status of the order. The Supreme Knight also references this information in his annual report on the state of the Order. This form is due January 31st. It can be filled out online or using the fillable PDF. Again, a copy should be sent to the state.

The final form each council needs to submit is the “Columbian Award Application” (form SP-7). This report determines which councils receive the Columbian Award. It requires the council submit at least four programs in each Faith in Action category. Certain programs are considered “feature” programs, and if the council has met certain criteria, feature programs can count for two. Feature programs need to be reported using the “Fraternal Programs Report Form” (form 10784). This report can be filled out by any member, but should be completed by the knight in charge of the program.

This report is customized for the primary Faith in Action programs, however it can be used for other programs as well. The member submitting this report will get a copy of his submission, which he should forward to the Grand Knight, council program director, and the state. Eventually this report will eliminate the SP-7 report. Grand Knights are recommended to keep these submissions organized and use them to help fill out the SP-7 and the 1728. The email address to send copies to the state is reports@kofc-ms.org.

So far, this article has focused on reports the council needs to present to Supreme, but the state also asks councils to submit some information. The first is the state directory. Three council personnel have access to this directory: the Grand Knight, the financial secretary, and the council program director. The first directory item that needs to be updated is the council information page. This page provides council meeting details, mailing address, selected officers, and what parish or parishes it supports. This information can be updated by any of the three personnel with access. If this is not updated, former officers may continue to get email that should be directed to the new officers.

The next area where the state seeks information is the Council Activity Report. Here the council provides information on various programs done during the year, as well as when certain key reports are submitted. The program information is similar to that submitted in the form 10784. The state database logs this information and can report that back out to the council to help submit the SP-7 and the 1728. This information can also be used by the Grand Knight to prepare his report to the state for the annual minute book.

Speaking of the minute book, it is currently being prepared for the 2024-2025 state fraternal year and the Grand Knight for that period is asked to submit a report as soon as possible.

Necrology is the final area where the state is asking the council for information. Each year, at the state convention, those knights who have passed during the previous year are remembered during the memorial mass. Members of the council ladies auxiliary are remembered as well. This is the ONLY way that the state knows who has passed during the year.

It is important to enter the information as soon as possible so the state secretary can send a sympathy card to the next of kin. While this may seem to be an insignificant gesture, it helps the families to know that their loved ones haven't been forgotten by the order.

Lastly, Grand Knights have received an invitation to join the Mississippi KofC Grand Knights Google Group. This invitation is an e-mail from Google (or Googlegroups.com, or something similar). It may be in your Spam folder.

Please accept this invitation. This is an easy way for state officers to communicate with you as Grand Knights to provide information in a timely manner. If you received this invitation and you are no longer Grand Knight, please contact the state secretary and provide the new Grand Knight's email address. Also go to the state website and correct your council information there.
